


One of the foundations of good governance is welfare. The Chief Minister planned, proposed

# Uttar Pradesh: A golden period beckons

UTTAR PRADESH'S JOURNEY OF TRANSFORMATION BEGAN EIGHT YEARS AGO WHEN
THE PRESENT GOVERNMENT, UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF CHIEF MINISTER YOGI
ADITYANATH, EARNED THE TRUST AND CONFIDENCE OF THE PEOPLE. IT MARKED THE
DAWN OF A NEW ERA FOR THE STATE, WITH THE WINDS OF CHANGE SWEEPING ACROSS
EVERY DIRECTION, USHERING IN GROWTH, PROGRESS, AND RENEWED HOPE

he journey of UP's rejuvenation started 8 years back when the present government gained the trust and confidence of the public and CM Yogi Adityanath was given the charge of Uttar Pradesh. In true sense, it was the beginning of a new dawn in Uttar Pradesh, where rays of hope and imagination had started changing the whole atmosphere. Public sentiment had started gaining momentum in favour of the new changes UP was undergoing.

### UPHOLDING THE RULE OF LAW


Safety of a citizen is one of its necessities. It is incumbent upon the government to ensure there is peace and harmony in society while crime is tackled effectively. Leaders, earlier, did not prioritise the safety of the citizens but the CM took steps under the direction of PM Narendra Modi.

He took the responsibility of implementing new resolutions and make them a ground reality. Uttar Pradesh has always been at the centre of power. In such a situation, once again, the eyes of the country were fixed upon the state and its new chief. The Chief Minister changed the scenario in no time.

A message was sent across the state to criminals and mafias that the new regime will focus on 'zero tolerance' policy against crime and criminals. Keeping this in mind, police forces were made more powerful. They were empowered with better facilities and technology, so that criminal activities can be stopped and eradicated from the state.

New reforms were taken for safety of women—a big issue in this whole process. From increased surveillance and patrolling for safety, to effective prosecution to keep criminals in jails. Awareness campaigns were undertaken to spread more awareness amongst women in this context.

Over the past eight years, more than 8,000 encounters have been carried out, resulting in the elimination of 222 criminals and injuries to over 8,118 offenders.





Nearly 80,000 offenders have been jailed, and over 900 individuals have been booked under the National Security Act (NSA). Many of these criminals were either involved in serious crimes or accused of attempting to incite communal violence.

### CROWNING GLORY OF GLOBAL INVESTORS' SUMMIT 2023

The 2023 UP Global Investors' Summit was the fruition of dedicated efforts. Investment proposals worth more than Rs 40 lakh crore were received during this summit. While more than 26,954 MoUs were signed, paving way for 1.1 crore employment opportunities in future. Thanks to the investor summit, the entire state is being looked at as a hotspot for investment and not just select reasons.

approximately Rs 11 lakh crore in Purvanchal, Rs 5 lakh crore in Bundelkhand and more than Rs 5 lakh crore in Madhyanchal is being brought in. The current infrastructural projects from expressways to roads and buildings are symptomatic of the free-flowing investment that is pouring in the region.


The GIS opened a channel of trust for investors who earlier could not fathom investing in smaller regions of UP. Additionally, 16% in renewable energy, 12% in electronics, 11% in industrial parks and 9% in education, logistics investment has also been generated.

### STATE OF INFINITE POSSIBILITIES

UP is one such state, which has expanded its possibilities at a fast pace in just a short span of eight years. Systematic and transparent policies have played an important role in this.

The guidance of PM Narendra Modi has given invaluable momentum to the development of the state. India's capability and talent that has been showcased on the international platform through strong leadership has given the country a new direction.

It was an achievement no less that 11 meetings of the G-20 were being held at four metropolitan cities. The occasion presented UP with a unique opportunity to put forth its rich culture, heritage,



infrastructure and scope and scale of development achieved to the world and put the state on a global map.

The tangible results of the same were visible when the international community descended to be a part of the Mahakumbh. The religious gathering was considered a divine event and tourists from across the world merely wanted to be a part of it since it was being organised by the Uttar Pradesh government. The state is now being looked at as an engine of progress and whose future has been made bright by policies of today.

### BECOMING SELF-RELIANT

PM Narendra Modi has put for the vision of 5 trillion-dollar economy. This dream is being realised by the CM Yogi Adityanath-led Uttar Pradesh government, and the state is on the path to contribute 1 trillion-dollars to the vision.

Such a bold idea of the future is only made possible when the government has true intentions, transparent policies, financial discipline and concerted efforts. The state is successfully inching closer to achieving this resolution.

Within the last 8 years, the per capita income of UP has doubled. The GDP of the state increased by more than double. The growth trajectory has an upward curve, and sky is the limit for this government.

### **MSME: THE FUTURE**

The state government is continuously enhancing several other amenities, with special emphasis on basic facilities like housing, clean drinking water, better health services, better education, etc along with infrastructure, electricity, irrigation and urban development. Through ODOP schemes and promotion of MSME sector, added push is being given to employment across regions.

To propel the growth of micro, small and medium enterprises and enhance their competitiveness, the government is planning to interconnect 155 industrial

clusters with a dedicated e-commerce platform.

The strategic move is expected to benefit over 50,000 industrial and manufacturing units of these clusters, administered by the UP State Industrial Development Authority (UPSIDA). A dedicated e-com portal is being developed by the UPSIDA, and will connect raw material suppliers, manufacturers, and finished goods vendors operating out of these 155 clusters.

Nivesh Mitra is already operational as a digital single window portal for investors, wherein entrepreneurs are open to the benefit of nearly 454 services of 37 departments online. UP has become an 'Achiever State' in Ease of Doing Business.

### CHARTING NEW PATHS OF CONNECTIVITY

With 13 expressways, today, UP is known as the 'Expressway

Capital' of India. Of these, 6 are operational, while work on the remaining is in full swing. In the last 8 years, the double engine government has expanded the expressway and connectivity infrastructure.

Bundelkhand Expressway and Purvanchal Expressway have provided unprecedented speed and access to new growth avenues to the backward areas of the state. Employment opportunities in the surrounding regions are on the rise. Before 2017, only 4 airports were functional in and now the number has reached 10. Four international airports are also operational in the state, and the one at Jewar is under construction. In the near future, there will be 21 airports in UP. Jewar Airport will be the biggest airport in Asia, upon completion.

### HEALTHY STATE IS A WEALTHY STATE

Covid-19 crippled the healthcare systems of many countries. CM Yogi Adityanath led the battle from the forefront and the government fought several new challenges that were one-of-its-kind. A state-wide team of officials and health experts was deployed to combat the pandemic. Cases were identified and isolated to treat them locally.

There was regular monitoring of the situation and instructions were given to the team to ensure that ample and timely resources (both medical and non-medical) are availed.

During the pandemic, more than 16.88 crore people were given both doses of corona vaccine. Total vaccination in Uttar Pradesh crossed the figure of 39.20 crore. The state is now working on the policy of 'One District One Medical College' in healthcare. In the last 8 years, multiple medical colleges have been made operational across the state, and around 22 medical colleges are under construction. Under the Special ommunicable Disease Control/ Dastak campaign, an intensive campaign was launched against AES-JE virus. CM's efforts ensured that Purvanchal became free from encephalitis. Today, up to 96% control has been achieved on deaths caused due to this disease.

### PROGRESS ALL THE WAY

One of the monumental decisions of the last 8 years has been the waiving off farmers' loans worth Rs 36,000 crore. Several efforts have been made to provide basic facilities for farmers. CM Yogi Adityanath has also been paying special attention to projects

related to public welfare.

Payments to the tune of over Rs 2 lakh crore have been made to sugarcane farmers. Today, UP's agriculturalists are being helped through Chief Minister Krishak Kalyankari Yojana, PM Kisan Samman Nidhi, Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana, PM Kusum Yojana and Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana, among several others.

UP is aptly called the 'State of Festivals'. The culture here has



been rich since antiquity. The Mahukumbh was the perfect amalgamation of history, mythology, ecology and culture while representative of traditions. religious fervour, folklore and epochal events. In addition, Deepotsav, Dev Deepawali, Kumbh, Braj ki Holi, Ganga Vilas cruise, Kashi Vishwanath Corridor are becoming strong links to enhance this heritage. Tourism has flourished therefore. Thematic tourism circuits including Buddha, Bundelkhand, Awadh and Ramayana, among others, are lending a new colour and feel to the tourism sector of UP.





# Cruising towards one trillion-dollar economy

An economy on the rise

ruising towards onetrillion economy, UP has gone through a sea of change in the last eight years. The size of budget is an example of this with the annual budget each year has seen substantial growth coupled with the growth in State Gross Domestic Product (GSDP) making state's journey easier towards achieving the target of

one trillion-dollar economy.

The special thing about the economic achievement of the UP budget is that it highlights sectoral growth. For the earlier governments, the budget was an annual exercise meant to display figures but in the last eight years the budget has grown and so has its impact. There is now a dedicated allocation to various aspects of governance that otherwise faced neglect and ignorance.

The budget size has shown consistent growth over the eight-year period, increasing from Rs 4,28,760.94 crore in 2018-19 to Rs 8,08,736.06 crore in 2025-26, nearly doubling in size.

For instance, the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) of UP for 2025-26 (at current prices) is projected to be Rs 30.8 lakh crore, amounting to growth of 12% over 2024-25. This is an





exponential growth in a year itself. The revenue surplus in 2025-26 is estimated to be 2.6% of GSDP (Rs 79,516 crore), as compared to a revenue surplus of 2.1% of GSDP (Rs 59,008 crore) at the revised estimate stage in 2024-25.

The fiscal deficit for 2025-26 is targeted at 3% of GSDP (Rs 91,400 crore). In 2024-25, as per the revised estimates, fiscal deficit is expected to be 3.4% of GSDP.

The latest budget for fiscal year 2025-26 has been the largest budget in the state's history, with 22%

allocated to infrastructure, 13% to education, and 11% to agriculture. The fiscal deficit was reported at 2.97%, with total debt at Rs 9,03,924.54 crore.

Opening up new horizons

he legacy left behind by the GIS 2018 is undeniable. It is also one for the history books. One may find it hard to envisage that a leader would be able to draw in thousand crores of investments through the Investors Summit 2018, within a year of assuming the apex position in the state. And now, it is remarkable to imagine that the same leader would pull off investments from across the shores. The state grew exponentially, every year and UPGIS 2023 was the perfect culmination of the sustained progress journey of Uttar Pradesh. The message was loud and clear that UP has arrived. CM Yogi Adityanath made it possible and UP is now at a glorious position.

A crucial aspect of this GIS edition was, that for the first time, special attention was given to tapping investment through dedicated outreach programmes. Roadshows and meetings were held ahead of the event so that a foundation for attracting investments was laid down. The confidence of the government was personified when roadshows were organised in 16 countries ahead of the event, and that too with aplomb. Such was the thundering success of roadshows and B2B meetings participated in by ministers and bureaucrats of UP government at various venues that the initial investment target of Rs 10 lakh crore was achieved much before the main event and target had to be revised upward, an achievement in itself.


of the summit will only reveal the meticulous planning and vision that went behind the scenes.

All government functionaries worked in tandem with CM's vision to work not only for the event but also for the future of the state. UP's achievements can be measured in economic terms

but its impact will be indelible.

CM Yogi Adityanath had already taken an innovative initiative before the UPGIS. The CM constituted a 48-member team, including 12 from the Indian Administrative Service, six each from the Indian Police Service and the Indian Forest Service officers (all retired) and 24 educationists to acquaint the youth with the employmentoriented schemes and policies of the government. In February, this team communicated with the vouth in different universities/ colleges, answered their queries related to employment, as well as made them aware of the utility of the Global Investors' Summit for the youth. In this context, the Chief Minister interacted with the 48-member special team of retired officers and senior educationists.









The remarkable success story unfolded during multiple interactive sessions in three days in February when almost the entire world gathered in Lucknow showing faith and belief in the steely will of the state government led by CM Yoqi Adityanath. 



An entry-controlled greenfield expressway will be built from Agra-Lucknow Expressway to Ganga Expressway (Kausiya, district Hardoi) via Farrukhabad, for which Rs 900 crore have been allocated. The Ground Breaking
Ceremonies that have been held
since 2018 have contributed to
the one-trillion-dollar vision and
the rise of the country's
economic stature. Companies
that once looked down upon the
state are now willing to place
large bets on the state's future.
The results are for everyone
to see.

Economic experts and institutions are now increasingly

acknowledging that UP has the potential to become an instrument of growth of a developed India. At a recent workshop organised by the planning department in Lucknow, it was stated that the state is has the potential for immense economic success.

Under the able leadership of CM Yogi Adityanath, Uttar Pradesh has emerged as one of India's most preferred investment destinations. Following the principles of Reform-Perform-Transform laid by the Prime Minister, the State Government has actively pursued a development agenda with a significant emphasis on industrial growth, bolstered by impactful governance reforms, a structured law and order situation, progressive policies, and the establishment of stateof-the-art greenfield infrastructure, encompassing Airports, Expressways, Metro Rails, Industrial Corridors. and more.

The first Uttar Pradesh
Investors Summit was held on
July 29, 2018, and the second
one took place on July 28, the
next year. In the first
groundbreaking ceremony,
81 projects with projected
investments of Rs 61,800 crore
were initiated while the second

saw 290 projects worth Rs 67,000 crore taking shape.

The third GBC, that took place in 2022, witnessed more than 60 captains from corporate and industry participating. The prime minister performed the 'bhoomi pujan' for about 2,000 projects worth Rs 75,000 crore at the groundbreaking ceremony.

After hosting the UPGIS 2023, the state has been able to implement more than 14000 projects with an estimated investment of approximately Rs 10 lakh crore and generating 33.50 lakh employment opportunities in short span of one year.

The GBC 4.0 was held last year and as many as 3,984 projects worth Rs 1.14 lakh crore have begun commercial operations in Uttar Pradesh within five months of groundbreaking ceremony. During GBC 4.0, steps were taken to secure investments totalling Rs 10.81 lakh crore across 14,701 projects, which generating employment for over 34 lakh people. GBC 4.0 marked the commencement of projects across four regions and 75 districts of the state of UP.

Among the projects inaugurated, eight aspirational districts in UP are witnessing the implementation of investment proposals amounting to Rs 1.57 lakh crore. These districts, including Bahraich, Balrampur, Chandauli, Chitrakoot, Fatehpur, Shravasti, Siddharthnagar, and Sonbhadra, have been identified under the aspirational districts programme initiated by the PM in January 2018. The programme targets at changing the socioeconomic composition of the area.

UP government is considering a move to hold yet another Ground Breaking Ceremony (GBC 5) later this year to ensure that the investments agreed to take shape on ground.

Additionally, a Global Investors Summit will be held thereafter to attract new investment.

CM Yogi Adityanath has asserted that the state government will achieve the trillion-dollar economy target by 2029. The government has planned to hold road shows in


major cities in India and abroad to market the state government's policies, offering incentives to attract investors and project the state as the best investment destination.

## Infrastructure Development

UTTAR PRADESH HAS MADE REMARKABLE PROGRESS IN DEVELOPING GLOBAL-LEVEL INFRASTRUCTURE, AND THIS PROGRESS ENCOMPASSES ALL OF SUB-SECTORS



ne of the markers of a state's progress is its ability to create and operate infrastructure. In ancient times, civilis ations evolved because good leaders looked ahead. Cities were built on the idea and vision of those in power. They went on to become a part of history and are still looked up to till this day. Uttar Pradesh's story of growth and its world class infrastructure is imprinting itself in history textbooks and will

become a template for future generations.

As one of the fastest growing economies in the country, the state government of Uttar Pradesh has rapidly developed establishment facilities, announced important policies thereby transforming the image of from an economically backward state to a progressive state. Uttar Pradesh is now rubbing shoulders with advanced and developed societies.

Uttar Pradesh has made remarkable progress in developing global level infrastructure. And this progress encompasses all aspects of infrastructure. The double engine government has always





focused on all around development and not just enhancing one sector.

The connectivity of air, water, road and rail networks being developed in the state is enabling the industries and manufacturing units of the state to seamlessly integrate various modes of transport to send their goods to markets in India and abroad.

#### **WATERWAYS**

Advancing by leaps and bounds in the field of waterway transport in India, UP has become the first state in the country to launch country's first inland waterway project on the historic Ganga Bhagirathi Hooghly River system.

The project is popularly

known as National Waterway 1 (NW1), which extends from Prayagraj to Haldia. About 1,100 km stretch from Varanasi to Haldia is already operational in the state.

There is immense potential to develop into a supply route for logistics and other by making into a corridor between North India and Kolkata Port.

NW1 covers 26% of the major catchment area of Uttar Pradesh and connects major export

In the last eight years, UP's image has transformed through good governance, development and policy reforms. As a result, the state has become a highly preferred destination for business and investments

centres like Varanasi and Prayagraj to Haldia Port, thereby boosting economic development by strengthening regional connectivity. Major monuments in the state like Assi Ghat and Rajghat (Varanasi) underline the important role of Uttar Pradesh in this direction. The waterways essentially create multidimensional transport and travel routes to the state facilitating both commercial business and tourism.

The operational facilities under National Waterway 1 (NW1) include a multi-modal Terminal at Varanasi and Floating Terminals at Ghazipur, Rajghat, Ramnagar (Varanasi) and Prayagraj. In addition, the development of a Multi Modal Logistics Hub at Dadri and a

Multi Modal Transport Hub at Boraki is in progress to further strengthen the logistics infrastructure.

#### **AIRWAYS**

The government has had its target in sight that people should have the privilege of travelling by air as much as possible. From expanding the network of air sectors and routes to making air travel affordable, the level of advancement in this industry has been phenomenal.

One of the key aspects of airways is having the right infrastructure. Large scale airports, multiple runways and dedicated aviation setups ensure aviation feasibility. Uttar Pradesh also provides seamless air travel facilities.

Uttar Pradesh has a total of 11 domestic airports in various cities including Prayagraj, Kanpur, Agra, Bareilly, Ghaziabad (Hindon), Aligarh, Azamgarh, Chitrakoot, Moradabad, Shravasti and Gorakhpur. These airports connect UP to major cities and metros of the country, thereby promoting economic development and tourism in the state.

Apart from domestic flights, UP government is now working towards operating flights to international destinations as well. At present, Uttar Pradesh has a total of four international airports, which provide connectivity to major destinations of the world.

Located in major cities like Lucknow, Ayodhya, Kushinagar and Varanasi, these airports provide better air travel options to foreign travellers as well as facilitate business, tourism and cultural exchange.

The new international airport under construction at Jewar in Gautam Buddha Nagar is in its final stages and will be made operational soon. The airport is poised to become one of the largest international airports in the country, spread over an area of about 5,000 hectares. Jewar Airport will be the crown jewel





of the NCR region. The airport is being developed by a Swiss company that is expert in aviation infrastructure.

## **EXPRESSWAYS**

The construction of expressways has become a model for the entire country to follow. The Lucknow Agra Expressway is compared with European freeways. It not only connects various parts of the state to the centre of the country It opens a passage for business as well. From giving benefits to an average citizen to raising the economy, the road most travelled now is the best option, changing the old adage.

Construction of various modern expressways in Uttar Pradesh is bringing about a remarkable transformation in the regional transport and connectivity system across the state. Seven major expressways such as Yamuna Expressway, Agra Lucknow Expressway, Purandar Expressway, Bundelkhand Expressway, Greater Noida Expressway, Delhi Meerut Expressway and Ganga Expressway have reduced travel time significantly

There is accelerated economic activity in the respective regions through travel of labour and raw materials. In addition, six more expressways are under construction in the state, taking the total number of expressways to 13.

Hailing the state as an Expressway Pradesh, the Chief Minister said, "Today, Uttar Pradesh has 40 per cent expressways. Ganga
Expressway will be completed
by December 2025 because 205
there is Prayagraj Kumbh. After
the completion of this
expressway, UP will have 55 per
cent of expressway networks,
the highest in the country."

The Ganga Expressway, the longest and one of the most ambitious infrastructure projects in Uttar Pradesh, is a glorious example of CM Yogi Adityanath's visionary development model. Spanning 594km, it will pass through Meerut, Hapur, Bulandshahr, Amroha, Sambhal, Badaun, Shahjahanpur, Hardoi, Unnao, Raebareli and Pratapgarh before reaching Prayagraj.

The Ganga expressway has recently brought both national and international recognition for the state by setting two world records.

In the Hardoi-Unnao division, a major achievement was recorded by laying down 34.2-km of bituminous concrete within 24 hours. The process involved covering 0.17 sqkm of area of the carriageway by deploying 20,105 cubic metres of bituminous mix, the highest construction progress made in 24 hours globally. The previous record of laying done bituminous material was made

in 2023 over the Ghaziabad-Aligarh expressway. Five hot mix plants each with a capacity of 200 tonne per hour are helping complete the Hardoi node.

Adding to this achievement. a second world record was set by installing 10 km of Thrie beam crash barriers in a day—a first such civil work execution done over an expressway in the country. The two milestones are a product of CM Yogi-led government's unwavering focus on speed, quality and transparency, backed by the constant monitoring. CM Yogi had inspected the key sections of the Ganga Expressway in Hardoi, including the emergency airstrip in Shahjahanpur and Ganga Setu in Hapur, and directed officials to ensure timely and high-quality execution.

To uphold international standards the expressway's riding quality and user comfort are evaluated using AI technology developed by ETH Zurich, Switzerland.

The recently finished 91-km-long Gorakhpur Link Expressway, connecting Gorakhpur to Azamgarh, is ready. This link not only promotes economic development in eastern UP but also serves as an important link between major manufacturing centres and the national capital region.

In earlier times, there was an understanding that the eastern part of the state has often been ignored and neglected. CM Yogi Adityanath proved that development means covering every part of the state. Roads are an

At present there are six e expressways operational, 11 in various stages of development.

## **DEFENCE CORRIDOR**

Uttar Pradesh is the fourth largest state in India and the third largest economy within the country. In the current context, UP has the highest number of available labour force making it one of the top manufacturing sites in the country.

Industrial Corridor (UP DIC) is
an aspirational project that
intends to reduce foreign
dependency of Indian aerospace
and Defence Sector.

There is development of Defense Industrial Corridor at 6 nodes in Lucknow, Aligarh, Kanpur, Jhansi, Agra and Chitrakoot. It has a big role in making the country self-reliant in the field of defense production.

In the Defense Industrial Corridor, under the Jhansi node, Bharat Dynamics Limited and Brahmos missile manufacturing unit in Lucknow, investment projects worth 30 thousand crores are under process so far

The Uttar Pradesh Defence Industrial Corridor (UPDIC) is set to attract investments worth Rs 28,481 crore with 170 Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) signed, 145 of which are with industries, and the remaining 25 with institutions.

Land has also been allotted to 57 industries, which are set to invest Rs 9,463 crore across various nodes of the UPDIC and are expected to generate 13,736 employment opportunities.

With the success of

## ENHANCED METRO CONNECTIVITY

CM Yogi Adityanath has made monumental efforts in improving public transport. The evolution of urban spaces is possible when there is an affordable transport system. In the last eight years, metro connectivity has been laid down with a smartly planned network that covers every part of the city.

Metro networks have been developed in cities to improve the modes of daily mobility. With this, Uttar Pradesh has made an incomparable record in the field of metro connectivity.

Apart from the capital city
Lucknow, Metro is operating
successfully in Ghaziabad,
Noida, Greater Noida, and
Kanpur. Uttar Pradesh Metro
Rail Corporation (UPMRC) is
also constructing Agra Metro
and Meerut Metro and plans for
Varanasi Metro, Prayagraj
Metro, Gorakhpur Metro and
Bareilly Metro are also
under consideration.

A plan has also been made to connect Greater Noida West Metro with Jewar, Asia's largest airport. It is under consideration to run Namo Bharat Train (Rapid Rail) to Jewar Airport, connecting Greater Noida and Greater Noida West, which will be further connected to Delhi-Meerut RRTS. Keeping in view the convenience of the people, discussions are ongoing on the route.

There is a proposal to provide connectivity from Ghaziabad station of Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) to Jewar Airport which is being built in Noida. Keeping in mind the local connectivity, now metro will also run on this route under Mass Rapid Transit System (MRTS). This 72.2 km stretch will be built from Noida Airport to Ghaziabad. Earlier, only 12 stations were proposed on this track, but now it has been increased to 25.

Metro service is also going to start soon in Agra, the fourth

largest city of the state. When fully functional, the Agra Metro will consist of two metro lines, with a total length of 29.65 kilometers (18.42 mi). In the first phase, there will be 14 metro stations on the Yellow Line from Sikandra to Taj East Gate. In the second phase, there will be 15 metro stations on the Blue Line from Agra Cantt to Kalindi Vihar.

The first phase of metro has started in Kanpur and the second phase was recently inaugurated by the Prime Minister earlier.

Kanpur Metro was inaugurated on December 28, 2021, and has been expanding ever since.

With 23 stations in the first phase and eight in the second phase, the Kanpur Metro Project is being built with a cost of Rs 13,721 crore.

Lucknow Metro is the seventh longest operational metro network in India.

Lucknow Metro covers 22.87 km with 22 stations and it is being expanded as well.

The Public Investment Board (PIB), last month, has approved the Rs 58 billion East-West Corridor of Lucknow Metro under Phase 1B, marking a major milestone for the city's expanding metro network. The corridor will connect Charbagh to Vasant Kunj.

development of International
Film City. Located in the Yamuna
Expressway Industrial
Development Authority (YEIDA)
region, the project aims to
establish UP as a major hub for
film production, media,
entertainment, and tourism.

The developer has been selected through a transparent global tendering process. The developer company Bayview Projects LLP, owned by filmmaker Boney Kapoor, has completed nearly all preparatory work. Bayview Projects LLP was selected as the bidder by offering the highest gross revenue share of 18%. The company received the letter of

award last year.

The geo-technical survey of the construction site is almost complete, and the company has finalised its building plan. The construction of International Film City is to begin in the first phase with 13-14 modern film sound studios, and a film institute spread over around 3 lakh sq meter. The entire project will be completed in three phases over eight years.

The Film City is being developed in Sector-21 along the Yamuna Expressway, over a total area of 1,000 acres. Phase 1 will cover 230 acres at an estimated cost of Rs 1,510 crore. In the future, the remaining 770 acres will be developed in Phase-2 and Phase-3.

YEIDA is set to start work on the project. Everything from land acquisition to farmer






The Film City will be replete with retail centres, food courts, amphitheatre, viewing galleries, helipads, restrooms, entertainment parks, museums and common parking.


The museum will be a world class facility with artefacts and antique collections depicting the Indian film industry and its heritage. This will would include facilities of film archives and processes.

investment approvals and project implementation and to speed up the work in line with the economic goals of the state.

UP government has established a timeline for the convenience of investors from the vear 2020 itself. With the aim of facilitating the process of signing the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) and providing proper assistance to the investors, an online investor relationship management portal Nivesh Sarathi has been developed by the state's investment promotion body Invest UP. This portal provides an integrated solution to investors for resolving their doubts and complaints, investment intent registration, project facilitation

and monitoring.

## POLICY-BASED GOVERNANCE

Uttar Pradesh has a strong focus on policy-based governance. 



This initiative aligns with the state's Solar Energy Policy–2022, which aims to reduce energy costs, promote environmental conservation, and cut carbon emissions
- The identified locations include strategic industrial hubs like Surajpur Site-5, EPIP (Gautam Buddha Nagar), TDS City (Ghaziabad), SEZ (Moradabad), Baghpat, Agra, Mathura, Jhansi, Prayagraj, and Shahjahanpur—that are set to become solar-enabled zones
- CM Yogi Adityanath has emphasised that industrial areas in the state should not only lead in production but also be energy self-reliant and environmentally friendly. # FPO POLICY 2020

The UP cabinet's FPOs policy 2020 is lending added momentum to Central government's decision to form 10,000 such units in the country by 2023-24. The state currently has 3175 FPOs comprising around 10 lakh farmers. UP government aims to set up 1,000 FPOs. Each block will have a FPO, comprising between 300 and 500 farmers. The state will also coordinate with the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) to help FPOs get loans from banks either as working capital or to set up food processing units, cold stores, branding and packaging units, warehouses, etc. Each FPO will be entitled to a maximum loan of Rs 2 crore.

The FPOs can operate at district, state and national level for the product identified as per their requirement of processing, branding and marketing.

Notably, 'One district, One product' policy will get a major thrust under this initiative.

# Revolution at the grassroot level

## Rural Development

Progress is a ladder. You climb the first step and slowly make your way to the top. In terms of governance, one must start the string of development from the very fundamental level of functioning. A country can only think of moving forward when the villages see change. In the modern era, villages need to be made self-reliant. Villages

being able to sustain themselves will give productive results in agriculture and other sectors

In the last eight years, UP has become the first to provide housing facilities to more than 56.50 lakh families. Nearly 36.15 lakh houses approved in Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Rural) while 35.77 lakh houses completed.



One step at a time-UP moving ahead

Housing has improved tenfold after 257 lakh houses have been approved in Mukhyamantri Awas Yojana (Rural), and 2.53 lakh houses have been completed.

Uttar Pradesh is the first state to compulsorily provide housing lease to every beneficiary of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana and Mukhyamantri Awas Yojana who did not have land to build a house.

Furthering the vision, the state government has selected 100 development blocks as aspirational development blocks. Deployment of Chief Minister Fellows for continuous monitoring of development beneficiaries is also being done.

Matrabhumi Yojana is

operating with the aim of ensuring direct participation of common people in the development of the village.

Another achievement of the state government has been to make records. Several policies and initiatives have taken the state to new heights. In line with this, Uttar Pradesh is first in the country in the construction of Sarovar.

A crucial aspect of good infrastructure is enhancing connectivity. There 149 works of 1385 km length that has been completed connecting 165 development block headquarters of the state with 02 lane roads.

In the financial year 2024-25 itself, about 40,000 kilometers of roads will be made pothole-

free and about 16,000 kilometers of routes will be renovated. Works of road construction of about 100 kilometers length completed using single-use waste plastic.

CM Yogi Adityanath has turned the state around in eight years and the progress of villages is unprecedented.

More than 33,157 rural pipe drinking water projects in the state have been made and solar energy on which 900 MW solar panels were installed.

Under the Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission, more than 95 lakh women from poor families were provided with 8.55 lakh self-help groups, 685 village organisations and 2, 945 cluster level associations.

Since the government took

over more than, 779 Common Service Centres and 25,916 Panchayat buildings were constructed.

For the first time, the G-em portal was integrated with the Government of India's software e-Gram Swarajya and the Gram Panchayats were linked to the online purchase system.

In case of death of Jam Pradhan, Kshetra Panchayat Pramukh, Zila Panchayat Adhyaksh and members while in office, a Panchayat Welfare Fund has been established to help their families, through which a total of 2022 dependent families have been provided assistance till now.

Rural roads have been reconstructed in a length of 32,074 km (from April, 2017 till now, 25,000 km) along with widening and beautification work of roads in length.



Every year, on an average, 4076 km of new construction of roads and 3184 km widening/beautification of roads has taken place. There is widening/strengthening of roads at an average of 9 km per day, new construction of



roads at an average of 11 km per day.

A total of 46 new national highways (length 4115 km) have been selected. As many as 70 new state highways (length 5604 km) declared along with 57 new major district road (length 2,831 km) have been declared.

Policy for Panchayat Sahayak Accountant Entry Operator for daily operation and successful implementation of Jan Sachivalaya has been established in every Gram Panchayat.

Under Operation Kayakalp, maintenance and repair of 83,066 primary and upper primary schools, strengthening of 24,580 Anganwadi buildings, renovation of 79,718 toilets has been undertaken.

Rs 1,120 crore electricity bill collection work was done by 10,500 electricity workers, due to which women of self-help



groups (electricity subsidies) received Rs 14.60 crore commission. A total of 2,510 fair price shops are being run by women members of self-help groups in the state.

Furthermore, Uttar Pradesh is the first state in the country to achieve the target of Awas Plus in Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana Gramin.

The state government has also been able to provide water to every household through pipe drinking water scheme by 2024.

Water security plan has been developed in 550 gram panchayats under the Atal Bhujal Yojana with the aim of improving groundwater management. Crores of houses have been distributed under PM Swamitva Yojana till now.

the reigns of the biggest state in the country in terms of population.

The pro-farmer slant of UP government could also be gauged by the documented facts as illustrated here:

Sugarcane area was 20.54 lakh hectares in 2016-17, which increased to 29.66 lakh hectares in 2024-25, due to which the income of farmers

- increased by Rs 43,364 per hectare at an average rate of Rs 370 per quintal
- Before 2016-17, where sugarcane production was 72 tonnes per hectare, it has increased to 85 tonnes per hectare in 2024-25
- Currently, 122 sugar mills are operational. The daily crushing capacity of sugar mills which was 7.50 lakh TCD before the year 2017, has now increased to 8.36 lakh TCD
- From March 2017 till now, three new sugar mills have been established, 06 sugar mills have been re-operated and capacity of 38 sugar mills has been expanded, due to which about 1.25 lakh people have got direct/ indirect employment

When a farmer grows, a nation grows. The CM, since the very beginning, knew that farmers need to be rewarded for their efforts.


The agricultural growth rate has increased from 8.6 percent in 2016-17 to 13.7 percent in t 2023-24. It is evident that the present CM Yogi Adityanath government has given a new lease of life to the farmer of the state who once fell on the blind spot of insensitive politicians.

With 9 climatic zones and more than 187.70 lakh hectares of agricultural land, Uttar Pradesh is the only state where 76 percent of the total available land is being used for agriculture, with a coverage of more than 86 percent of irrigated land.

The state produced only 557 lakh metric tons of food grain during 2016-2017 as opposed to about 669 lakh metric tons in 2023-24. Food grain productivity in 2016-17 was about 27 quintals per hectare, which has

In a first, Uttar Pradesh has topped in the country by producing 400 lakh tons of fruits and vegetables per year. Oilseed productivity was only 12.40 lakh metric tons in 2016-17, which has increased by 128 percent to 28.31 lakh metric tonnes in 2023-24.

The efforts to improve the agriculture industry are not in isolation. It requires the co-operation of international institutions and other organisations that are willing to lend a supporting hand in this endeavour. With Ease of Business and a virtuous promise of a bright future, several organisations are more than willing to support UP government's efforts.

In the same vein, Agriculture Development and Rural Entrepreneurship Strengthening Program (UP AGRIS) was launched with the World Bank support for the rejuvenation of agriculture sector. There is direct benefit to 21 districts of Purvanchal and seven districts of Bundelkhand.

PM Narendra Modi, during his very first tenure, had promised to increase farmer income. Uttar Pradesh government has made striving efforts to put the dream to fruition. More than Rs 80,000 crore transferred to more than 2.86 crore farmers through PM Kisan Samman Nidhi.

The Chief Minister Farmers
Accident Welfare Scheme
implemented in September
2019. More than 63 thousand
farmers benefited from it. There
was Rs 47,555.09 crore
compensation given to 58.07
lakh farmers under Pradhan

There has been an allocation of more than 76,189 solar pumps to farmers under PM Kusum Yojana. This further complements the vision of the government to develop solar energy and focus on self-reliant electricity generation.

Oilseed productivity was only 12.40 lakh metric tons in 2016-17, which increased by 128 percent to 28.31 lakh metric tons in 2023-24.

Steps have been taken to reform the distribution system as well since progress is not merely restricted to the production aspect. There is modernisation of 27 new Mandi sites and construction of 185 'Haat-Paith' along with pre-

arrival e-pass for farmers in mandis. Facility of digital payment of mandi traders has been launched byt he UP government.

Digital trade worth about 6 thousand 99 crores till January, 2025, in 125 mandis of the state was realised to provide fair price to the farmers for their produce. Under the e-Mandi scheme, 6,922 e-licenses have been issued during this period and more than 4.18 crore online slips have been issued in e-mandis. The state's push towards digitisation has reached the

rural areas and farmers are emerging as beneficiaries.

To add to it, under the schemes operated for farmers and traders/commission agents through Mandi Samitis, grant amount of about 98 crore 50 lakhs has been distributed to 48,210 farmer beneficiaries from 2019-20 till date.

Further, UP government has also simplified the process of getting fair price for the produce of farmers in eight districts, constructed eight new mandi / sub-mandi, and Kisan Agrimall in Lucknow at a cost

of Rs 49 crore is in the state of completion.

To increase agricultural production, about 66 lakh quintals of quality seeds were distributed in 2024-25. State Seed Corporations are responsible for producing and distributing certified seeds through various channels, including their own outlets, private dealers, and departmental outlets and have been upgraded.

To increase the fertility of the land, about 95 lakh metric tonnes of fertilisers were distributed to the farmers in 2024-25. About 8.50 lakh soil health cards have been distributed. Earlier the state would plunge into fertiliser crisis with lack of materials and the products often not reaching farmers in time. Corrective measures have been taken in this regard.

Across the state, cow-based natural agriculture is being done in 23,500 hectares of area in all the areas of Bundelkhand.

Canteen and rest house are being established in the name of Mata Shabri in every Krishi Mandi. Food will be made available at subsidised rates in canteens

Meanwhile, Construction work of Integrated Pack House has

been completed in Amroha, Varanasi and Sahajanwa along with 88 rural haat markets.

As a sign of true digital era, for the benefit of farmers, android mobile app 'UP Mandi Bhaav' has been launched, where information about the market price and weather of agricultural markets is being made available free of cost every day.

Under the Chief Minister

have been distributed to farmers
while celebrating the birth
anniversary of former Prime
Minister, Late Chaudhary
Charan Singh, as 'Kisan
Samman Diwas'.

Earlier, for the benefit of farmers, only 1 scheme was running in UP before 2017-18. At present 5 new schemes are being run.

While doing farmer registration in 2024-25, a total of 60.48 lakh farmer card IDs have been issued till December 2024.

Up until now, a total of 1,551 flood projects have been completed for flood protection, benefiting crores of population by saving more than 32.87 lakh hectares of land. Seedlings are being produced through women self-help groups, due to which, about 60,000 women have got employment opportunities.

A decision has been taken to establish a seed park in the name of Bharat Ratna former Prime Minister Chaudhary Charan Singh ji at a cost of Rs 251 crores in Lucknow.

In May, this year, the Chief Minister said that scientists working in laboratories, ICR, agricultural universities, and Krishi Vigyan Kendras will, for the first time, go to the fields to work directly with farmers and help tackle agricultural challenges.

Launching the Viksit Krishi
Sankalp Abhiyan in Uttar
Pradesh the CM stated, "The
main goal of the campaign is to
take research 'from lab to land.'
Agricultural scientists will not
only carry out research in labs
but will also visit farms and
interact with farmers.

This will spark a new revolution in the agriculture sector. The work being done in research centres should be clearly visible on the ground."

When Yogi Adityanath became the Chief Minister in 2017, he sent out a clear message that the government will do everything to engage the youth in meaningful activities and help build their future.

During the tenure of CM Yogi Adityanath, UP government launched the UP Public Examination (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act for fair conduct of examinations.

The formation of Employment Mission Committee is in process and a one-time Registration (OTR) system has been implemented in UPPSC for the convenience of the candidates.

For instance, employment opportunities for more than 1.10 lcore youth from investment proposals were received in the Global Investors' Summit 2023. UP government has even provided employment to 1.65 crore people in MSME sector through its various financial and business-oriented policies.

Skilling of youth takes centerstage

ission Rozgar, launched by the CM Yogi Adityanath-led government in Uttar Pradesh, on December 5, 2020, is an ambitious initiative aimed at generating employment opportunities for the state's youth, both domestically and internationally. The program has evolved into a comprehensive effort to address unemployment through government jobs, private sector opportunities, and

skill development. Below is a detailed overview of Mission Rozgar's progress over the last eight years (2017–2025), based on available information.

### KEY ACHIEVEMENTS OF MISSION ROZGAR (2017–2025)

#### **GOVERNMENT JOBS:**

- Over 7.5 lakh to 8.50 lakh government jobs have been provided in the last eight years, significantly empowering the youth of Uttar Pradesh
- The Uttar Pradesh Public Service Commission (UPPSC) and Uttar Pradesh Subordinate Services Selection Commission (UPSSSC) have been instrumental in this process:
- UPPSC: Selected 48,593 candidates from April 1, 2017, to March 20, 2025. The highest recruitment year was 2019–20, with 13,893 selections, while 1,918 candidates were selected in 2024–25 (up to March 20, 2025)
- UPSSSC: Selected 46,032 candidates, with the peak in 2022–23 at 11,800 selections. In 2024–25, nearly 6,106 youth secured jobs through UPSSSC

- A significant achievement includes the fair, impartial and merit-based recruitment of 2.16 lakh police personnel, including 27,178 women, strengthening the state's law enforcement and positioning the UP Police as one of the strongest in India
- Over 8.5 lakh government jobs have been reported in some sources, indicating a broader impact, including 3.75 lakh contract-based jobs

Mission Rozgar has transformed Uttar Pradesh's employment landscape over the past eight years, providing over 7.5–8.5 lakh government jobs, 2 crore private sector/MSME jobs, and facilitating international opportunities with significant remittances. The initiative's focus on transparency, skill development, and women's empowerment aligns with the state's broader economic goals. However, achieving targets like1.25 lakh annual jobs (domestic and abroad) and scaling to projected target of 20 million jobs will require sustained efforts, robust infrastructure, and clear reporting to maintain credibility for which the CM Yogi-led government has already shown its steely resolve

- like Germany (nurses), Japan (caregivers), and Croatia (electricians and plumbers)
- Uttar Pradesh, in fact, has secured India's first government-operated overseas recruitment license, allowing direct facilitation of international job placements without relying on private recruiting agents

- A new digital portal by UPDESCO is under development to streamline applications and grievance redressal for construction workers
- Women's Empowerment
- In a significant policy shift, women are now permitted to work in all 29 categories of hazardous industries (previously limited to 12, later 16), provided safety conditions are met. This move aims to provide equal employment opportunities and support UP's economic goals
- Welfare benefits for construction workers' daughters have been enhanced, with marriage assistance proposed to increase from Rs 60,000 to Rs 1 lakh

 As of November 2024, Uttar Pradesh's Lakhpati Didi programme has achieved remarkable success in boosting women's economic independence. This initiative has seen over 1.37 lakh women in the state become 'lakhpatis,' meaning they now earn an annual income of Rs 1 lakh or more. The scheme has notably led to income growth among 13.28

- lakh women Self-Help Group (SHG) members. with an ambitious target of making 28.92 lakh women lakhpatis over the next three years
- The Mukhyamantri Samuhik Vivah Yojana, introduced in October 2017, provides crucial financial assistance for mass weddings. particularly benefiting economically weaker families in Uttar Pradesh. Initially, the scheme offered Rs 51,000 per couple. However, a significant revision in 2025 saw this aid increased to Rs 1 lakh per couple, and the annual income eligibility expanded from Rs 2 lakh to Rs 3 lakh
- The BC Sakhi Yojana, launched on May 22, 2020, in Uttar Pradesh, has transformed rural financial inclusion by appointing over 50,000 rural women as Banking Correspondents (BC Sakhis). These women play an important role in providing essential banking services at the grassroots level. Each BC Sakhi receives a monthly honorarium of Rs 4,000 for six months, along with device support to perform their duties effectively. Their efforts have yielded



In the last eight years, there have been 22.12 lakh beneficiaries under Mukhyamantri Kanya Sumangala Yojana, 30.98 lakh beneficiaries under Nirashrit Mahila Pension Yojana, 18,990 beneficiaries under Mukhyamantri Bal Seva Yojana (Covid) and 53,610 beneficiaries under Mukhyamantri Bal Seva Yojana (General). To add to it, more than 2 lakh women benefitted from PM Swanidhi Yojana.

There are nearly 95 lakh women in rural that were added to 87,3534 self-help groups (SHGs), 57482 village organisations and 3,137 cluster level associations under Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission.

To further economic independence, 2,510 fair price shops were allotted to women self-help groups under the public distribution system.



Starting July 1, Uttar Pradesh planted 4.12 crore saplings near rivers, covering 24,271.66 hectares across 13 major rivers. Triveni saplings—a sacred trio of Neem, Peepal, and Pakad—will also be planted along the riverbanks.

A total of 1.09 crore saplings were planted across 6,712.44 hectares on the banks of the Yamuna, over 77 lakh over 4,356.13 hectares along the Ganga. A total of 53 lakh saplings were planted along the Betwa, 34.25 lakh along the Gomti, 12.22 lakh along the Ken, and 4.29 lakh saplings will beautify the Hindon bank.



he UP government provided a healing touch, and a stern message was sent to those who were making life difficult for the residents of the state. Strict action was taken against real estate developers who took indefinite time to deliver flats.

As a result, housing infrastructure improved. There are roads being built, infrastructure being created and lives becoming better.

There is something about the way UP government is pacing forward with its growth model, 'Ease of Living' (EoL). Earlier,

UP registered a steady rise with 14 cities of the state appearing on the EoL index. This has been possible with state's special focus on public welfare projects. For instance, through schemes like the PM Awas Yojana for rural and urban regions and Swachh Bharat mission, all 762 local bodies of the 75 districts in the state have been declared as Open Defecation Free (ODF).

Nearly 2.35 lakh houses have been approved for construction under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana —Urban 2.0 (PMAY-U 2.0) during the third meeting of Central Sanctioning and Monitoring Committee (CSMC) held in June this year.

Earlier, the Happiest City Index released a list of 40 cities around the world that are ideal destinations for tourists. Kanpur was chosen and ranked as one of the happiness cities by taking into account various measurable happiness factors. Kanpur ranked 9th on the friendliest people category with 70.42 life expectancy and cost of living at 311.38. Lucknow, according to a survey done by electronics major LG and market research company IMRB International, is the second happiest city in the country, after Chandigarh. This would

have been impossible during earlier regimes.

In recent years, UP government has made remarkable progress under the Jal Jeevan Mission's 'Har Ghar Jal' scheme ensuring access to clean drinking water for more than 14 crore rural residents.

Additionally, over 2 crore rural households have been provided with functional household tap connections and over 99% schools and anganwadi centres have access to tap water supply.

Uttar Pradesh has also seen an incredible 68.8 per cent rise in the quality of water in its rivers and reservoirs in 2024 compared to the previous year. This notable progress was detailed in a recent report by the Uttar Pradesh Pollution Control Board (UPPCB), which credited the improvement to the state's strengthened focus on

pollution control and water preservation.

The UPPCB attributed this positive change to consistent government-led initiatives, enhanced environmental oversight, and significant development in water treatment infrastructure. This achievement. represents a major step toward the state's broader environmental goals and reflects the success of targeted efforts under programmes such as the Namami Gange Mission. Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. and various local pollution control measures.

As of April 2025, the state boasts 152 STPs, out of which, 141 are operational, with 126 already meeting environmental discharge norms. Six units are undergoing testing, and 15 more are expected to become operational in the coming months.



## TRANSFORMING CONSTRUCTION LAWS

- Government has introduced Bazaar Streets in its draft of the Uttar Pradesh Building Construction and Development Bylaws 2025, which aims to replace the existing 2008 regulations
- The draft, now open for public feedback, proposes a significant shift by allowing increased commercial activity within residential zones
- Under the new provisions, Bazaar Streets must have a minimum right-of-way of 12 metres—or as specified in the master plan—with commercial usage permitted across the entire plot depth

- The 2025 draft incorporates all amendments and notifications made to the 2008 bylaws and aims to overhaul urban development norms. The first bylaws were introduced in 2000, and the current ones, formulated in 2008, have undergone periodic amendments

Reclaim slum spaces to provide better housing, bettering road networks and improving existing drainage systems are among many measures being taken by the government for urban spaces. Since time immemorial, society has evolved only after planned development of cities. UP in its quest for becoming a state of the future, has prepared a detailed road map in the last eight years for advanced cities.

For this purpose, the government has created a unified portal for government schemes to serve as an information hub, offering comprehensive details on schemes across various directorates. At its very core, lies a smart dashboard, providing real-time insights into critical metrics.

Uttar Pradesh government has sanctioned and completed the construction of 17.70 lakh houses under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban). Providing housing is not merely a government move. The Chief Minister is, personally and emotionally, invested in ensuring that a family has a roof on their head. In Uttar Pradesh, housing is not a privilege but a right.

There has been formation of 125 new municipal bodies apart from new municipal corporations in Ayodhya, Mathura-Vrindavan and Shahjahanpur.

Uttar Pradesh is the only state in the country with 18 safe cities and 17 smart cities. Under the Smart City Scheme, work on 757 projects worth more than 10,300 crores is in progress in all 17 municipal corporations.

#### **KEEPING CITIES CLEAN**

Sanitation and cleanliness of a city is imperative to be considered an advanced state. The government has not only

carried out policy measures but have infused a sense of inspiration in the public to keep their surroundings clean. A true developed state is one where the public work in tandem with the government.



aw and order the medicine of body politic. When body politic gets sick, medicine must be administered."

This, precisely, was the vantage point for CM Yogi Adityanath when he took charge of the state in 2017. That

was the time when Uttar
Pradesh was mired in the worst
phase in terms of mafiadom,
criminal activities, and political
paralysis to deal with it. Today,
the scene is reversed and
results are for everyone to see
within and outside the state.

In the most basic terms, law

and order can be defined as a set of rules and principles that govern a society. It gives a basic structure which gives the idea of right and wrong to a common man. It is the role of the government to ensure law and order through its various mechanisms. And policing is the biggest component of it.

In Uttar Pradesh, law and order also reflects the will of the society. Prior to 2017, the streets were unsafe. In fact, people were not secure in their homes. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath instilled a feeling of confidence and safety through meticulous planning and infallible courage.

It takes a leader with steel nerves and robustness to carry out changes that have a deep impact on society. With Yogi Adityanath as the CM, it became clear as crystal that there would be zero tolerance against crime. The state could simply not continue to be a safe haven for criminals that functioned with impunity.

Whip was cracked and measures began to take shape. Police Commissionerate system implemented in Lucknow, Gautam Buddha Nagar, Kanpur Nagar Varanasi, Agra, Ghaziabad and Prayagraj. There was also formation of a new

security force called Uttar Pradesh Special Security Force that provided a deeper forensic view of the crimes taking place.

An aspect of crime control that often goes unnoticed is the follow up to any investigation in the due court of law. To make a policy reach its zenith, no aspect cannot be ignored. Through dedicated efforts, Uttar Pradesh ranks first in the country in the use of e-prosecution system.

In the action against dreaded criminals, till now 222 criminals have been killed in encounters and 8,118 injured. Out of these, 28,085 wanted criminals have been sent to jail. Gangster Act action against 79,984 criminals and NS action against 130 criminals. This goes on to show that criminals have not been merely caught but their backbones that helped them get back on the feet have been targeted.

Under the Gangster Act, movable and immovable illegal properties worth more than Rs 142 billion 46 crore 18 lakh have been confiscated. Taking financial action has proven to be more decisive and fruitful.

A total of 795 cases registered against 1,408 out of 68 identified mafias and their gang members/ associates at the state level and

617 arrested, action taken for cancellation of 359 arms licenses, NSA against 18, Gangster Act against 752, property worth more than Rs 4,076 crore illegally earned by mafias and criminals confiscated.

In terms of new infrastructure, 126 new posts, 86 new outposts, 4 water police posts, 78 women police post counseling, 75 antielectrocution police stations, 10



vigilance establishment Shanta, 4 economic crime unit police stations, 6 UPSSF, cybercrime police station and 6 new narcotics posts have been built. This shows that there is an increased presence of the police institution and that all functioning areas have been encompassed.

There has been an unprecedented improvement in 2024 as compared to 2017. Simple yet effective indications like the time of UP-112 been reduced from 5 minutes 42 seconds to 7 minutes and 24 seconds, indicates UP's effective approach towards law and order.

Through social media cognizance of the complaints received on X, 21 thousand 655 FIRs have been registered since the year 2017.

Uttar Pradesh Illegal Religious Conversion Bill was passed that paved way for Provision of maximum life imprisonment has been made for those found guilty of marrying a girl by luring her and converting her religion illegally.

The bedrock of any safe society is characterised by the safety of women. In a civil society, a woman should be able to freely commute on the streets without the fear of being the target of a crime. CM Yogi Adityanath, in the beginning of his tenure itself, sent out a stern warning to criminals that the state will not tolerate any breach of women security. One can now say that in the context of offences against women, Hell hath no fury like the UP police's scorn.

### To ensure that such crimes do not take place, several measures have been taken:

- There has been an Integration of Women Power Line 1090, GR JP, Fire Service, Women Helpline 181 service
- Formation of Anti Romeo
   Squad in every district
- Formation of Women and Child Protection Organisation 1090. Deployment of a woman SHO in one other police station in addition to the women police station in every district
- UP has secured the first place in the country in the disposal of cases related to women and child crimes (99.42 percent disposal rate)
- There are now eight women PAC battalions, process of formation of five other PC battalions is in progress
- The accused were convicted in 27,425 cases of crimes against women and minors,

- 11,254 cases under POCSO Act and 3,775 cases of dowry deaths
- There has been a mass recruitment of police personnel in 2 lakh 16 thousand 450 posts. More than 10,378 women beats were allotted while appointing more than 27,178 women police personnel
- There is availability of 346 women PIRVs for the safety of women
- Various campaigns like

An interesting and ingenious method of reducing crime has been through digital means. The research and development that goes in developing new technology for state police has led to a revolution. There is exponential ease in maintaining crime related data and also provides and important platform

for citizens to register aggrievances.

For instance, UPCOP App has been developed under CCTNS scheme. 27 types of services including online FIR registration are being provided. Prahari Beat Policing App has been developed and integrated with CCTNS. Effectively, police is now the mobile screen touch away.

For the purpose of training police personnel, online CCTNS web training portal has been made available under CCTNS module on UP Police website.

There is an automated system to search details of criminals through CCTNS. Crime Analytics, Crime Data Portal, Important Crime Monitoring Portal, Field Unit Portal and Investigation, Police Parade Portal have been developed.

The process of developing Investigating Officer App (10 Apps) is underway.

This goes in line with larger philosophy of the state. Time and again the Prime Minister Modi and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath have mentioned the importance of modernisation. It is something that is being applied to various government departments. The decrepit government buildings and the rotting files are slowly become a sight of the past. In the new double engine government there is a high-tech approach and a high-tech resolution.

There is online licensing/ renewal of private security agencies and online revenue collection through private security agency (PSARA PORTAL).

At present, UP-112 is

operating 4,800 PRV vehicles and providing emergency assistance to an average of 30,000 callers daily, whereas earlier this figure was 18,500. In view of transparency and better management, body worn cameras have been provided to the personnel deployed on 6,278 PRVs. Such techniques have been implemented after gaining exposure from security systems around the world.

The government has always had a fundamental approach to things. CM believes that once we make the foundation strong, the resulting structure will hold shape for years to come. To further that, police training capacity has been doubled.

In view of the appointments being made in Uttar Pradesh Police, the training capacity is twice now. Police Training School Sultanpur, Police Training School Jalaun have been established. Process is underway to double the capacity of Shaheed Gulab Singh Lodhi, Police Training Centre, Unnao, Police Training School, Sitapur and Dr Bhim Rao Ambedkar Police Academy, Moradabad.

In many ways, UP's Special Task Force is a crown jewel. At the moment, being on STF's radar is a straight ticket to jail.


Technological upgradation of

UP Special Task Force was done and strict action was taken against organised crime and mafia elements by using switch-based interception monitoring system, mini cyber lab, and audio/video based analytical system.

One can see the relief a common man has knowing that no mafia in the state can bother

I reiterate, if the mafia dares to raise its head, the government will destroy it," said CM Yogi Adityanath while sending out a strong and stern message to the criminals.

Dacoit-affected areas have been made dacoit free and there is eradication of organised mafia gangs. There has been a complete end to



him. The police has instilled such a fear that most criminals associated with gangs or organised crimes are surrendering on their own or stopping their activities.

"It is our responsibility to provide security to every citizen and my government will go to any extent to ensure the security of our daughters and sisters. And kidnappings. Through effective monitoring, cell phone tracking carrying out a kidnapping is becoming more and more difficult for the criminals.

There is also the elimination of nomadic Bawaria criminal gangs. Action against those smuggling illegal arms, narcotics, illegal liquor, wildlife smugglers and counterfeit currency.

While it is next to impossible to summarise the efforts of the police over the course of the last 8 years, some figures give us a glimpse into the effectiveness of modern policing. The government has backed security forces to the hilt providing them with the necessary resources and environment. In return, safe streets and secure homes have been given to the people of Uttar Pradesh.

- STF arrested 6,987 criminals from March 2017 to January 2025. As many as 57 criminals were killed in encounters

While upgrading the infrastructure of the Anti Terrorist Squad, spots were formed in Ghaziabad, Ayodhya, Lucknow and 18 field units and 11 ops teams were established. The ATS was equipped with state-of-the-art technology, arms, cyber experts, modern software, apps tools, world-class training, mock drills and the latest software. The ATS has been proactive in identifying cases of forced religious conversions. Going beyond the mandate of arrest, ATS has been able to gather effective evidence and material that has made the iobs of the courts easier resulting in accurate convictions as well.

The government has gone after the very idea of corruption. In addition to the operating units of the Anti-Corruption Organization, 08 new units have been set up at the regional level in Azamgarh, Basti, Chitrakoot, Banda, Devipatan, Gonda, Mirzapur, Saharanpur, Aligarh and Prayagraj.

From 2017 to January 2025, 85 public servants were punished with rigorous imprisonment and fine in corruption cases by the Court. In a true democratic set

up where the interests of the people are at the highest level, no officer is above persecution.

There has been an establishment of 18 regional cyber crime police stations for prevention of cyber crimes.

Advanced cyber forensic lab at cyber-crime headquarters

Lucknow, basic cyber forensic lab at 18 regional police stations and 57 district cyber crime police stations are under process.

In the modern era, offences have evolved to new forms. From spam calls to phishing pages, a new world of crime has come to our doors and we must fight it. The state law and order has been one hand ahead working tirelessly to tackle cyber crimes.

Cyber cells have been made functional in all 75 districts.
Cyber cell operating at district level expanded to police station level.

There are currently 75 antihuman trafficking units that have been converted into police stations for effective control over incidents of human trafficking.

A total of 1,09,437 loudspeakers installed at religious places were removed and the volume of 1,65,515 loudspeakers was reduced when the sound quality of loudspeakers was found to be not up to the prescribed mark.

No investigation if possible if the evidence connected to it is not documented properly. Forensic science laboratories are now functional in Lucknow, Varanasi, Agra, Ghaziabad, Jhansi, Prayagraj, Gorakhpur, Kannauj, Aligarh, Bareilly, Gonda and Moradabad. 
Monitoring of UP police is considered one of the best in the country. It has been next to impossible for mafias and gangsters to escape the watchful eyes of the cameras. There has

been an installation of 11,30,510 CCTV cameras under Operation Trinetra Abhiyan. Through this, 5,718 crimes related to murder, robbery, kidnapping, snatching, pickpocketing etc were disclosed and legal action was taken.

Experts say that compared to 2016, there has been a significant decrease in crimes every year. For example, there has been a decrease of 84.41 percent in robbery, 77.43 percent in loot, 41.01 percent in murder, 66.40 percent in riot incidents, 54.72 percent in kidnapping for ransom, 17.08 percent in dowry murder and 26.15 percent in rape incidents.

Under Operation Conviction, from July 2023 to December 2024, 51 accused have been awarded death penalty, 6,287 accused have been awarded life imprisonment, 1,091 accused have been awarded sentences of more than 20 years, 3,868 accused have been awarded sentences ranging from 10 to 19 years, and 5,788 accused have been awarded sentences of less than 5 years.

By effectively pleading in cases and cases against identified mafia gangs, 31 mafias and 14 organized criminals have been sentenced to life imprisonment separately. Two have been



awarded death penalty.

Under Operation Conviction, from July 2023 to December 2024, 51 accused have been awarded death penalty, 6,287 accused have been awarded life imprisonment, 1,091 accused have been awarded sentences of more than 20 years, 3,868 accused have been awarded sentences ranging from 10 to 19 years, and 5,788 accused have been awarded sentences of less than 5 years.

More than 653 heinous crimes have been prevented by STF

before they even happened since the year 2017. Arrest of 130 terrorists and 171 Rohingya / Bangladeshi and associates by ATS since 2017.


There is a promulgation of new revised Jail Manual- 2022. The remand proceedings of prisoners are being done through video conferencing units operating in 74 prisons and district courts of the state.

As many as 4,800 CCTV cameras have been installed for the security of prisons, for which a video ball has been installed in the headquarters to receive the feed. As many as 271 mobile phone jammers of UG capacity

have been installed in 24 prisons.

The progress of law and order over the last eight years is only a glimpse into the future. From modern methods to effective monitoring, every step has been thought out. The police have also been able to provide a muchneeded humane touch and there is a general satisfaction among the public. They are finally able to see the police as their protector and their leader as guardian.

The CM rightly said, "UP government stands firmly with every person in need. Our mission is to ensure the security and respect of every citizen."

REFORMS, TRAINING PROGRAMMES FOR SCHOOL TEACHERS, THE USE OF TECHNOLOGY, AND FOCUS ON CONSTRUCTION, EXPANSION AND BEAUTIFICATION OF SCHOOLS HAVE PLAYED A KEY ROLE IN MAKING EDUCATION ACCESSIBLE TO EVERY CHILD IN UP

Currently, 1.93 crore children in the state are getting quality education in council schools.

Through innovative efforts like School Chalo Abhiyan and Sharda Programme (Come to School Every Day) there has been a sizeable enrollment of 40 lakh additional children and there is a significant decline in drop out rate.

When it comes to education, it is not merely about getting a child to school. There needs to be enough incentives for

the child and the parent to continue education and ensure that it is not discontinued midway. The government has been able to not only draw children to school but has also ensured they stay through quality measures.

Under the Sharda programme, 7.77 lakh children have been admitted to council schools in the year 2024-25. Within the Right to Education Act, 10,784 children were studying in 2016-17 and in the last eight years, the number has increased to more than 4.58 lakh. For this, more than Rs 728 crore fee reimbursement has been paid by the state government to unaided recognised schools from financial year 2022-23 to 2024-25.

School is not merely just books and pens. There is an entire paraphernalia that a child needs for everyday school education. The state government is transferring Rs 1,200 for each student through DBT to the account of their parents to provide free uniforms, sweaters, school bags, shoes, socks to the students since 2021-22.

Efforts like these reflect that very thinking of the government. Policy makers have thought about every little aspect of a child's future.

In the years to come, several aspects of the school infrastructure will become obsolete. The next big things, while already in application, is the digitisation of the classrooms. From projectors to screens, there are several methods through which the classrooms are being made state of art.

The digital education is

being promoted by ensuring the availability of smart classes, 5,588 ICT labs and more than 2.61 lakh 61 tablets in 25,784 council schools. There has been distribution of tablets to 2,10,000 teachers of council primary and upper primary schools of basic education.

UP has seen the upgradation of 680 Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya by providing free residential education to girls of weaker sections till class



12.

The state government has also inaugurated Purvanchal's first Sainik School in Gorakhpur. Operation of Atal Residential Schools has started in 18 divisions.

UP government has also taken a decision to upgrade selected schools under the PM Shri scheme and develop them as Green Schools. In addition, 39 new high schools and 14 new inter colleges in unserved areas have been constructed.

To promote Hindi learning,

smart classes have been established in 18 thousand 381 council upper primary composite and Kasturba Gandhi schools and ICT labs in 880 schools.

Before 2017, 93 Ashram system schools in UP were operating; currently they have been upgraded as Jai Prakash Narayan Sarvodaya Vidyalaya. Today, 120 schools are operating. As many as 377 council schools from preprimary and class 1 to class 8 are being upgraded as Chief Minister Anandaya Composite School.

Upgradation of present school buildings and facilities is something that needs to be done timely. There would be a political photo op when the foundation stone of a school or college was laid down. But what came about of the policy was never a priority.


With the aim of connecting the children of Vantangiya villages with education, 22 primary and 11 upper primary schools have been constructed in Gorakhpur and Maharajganj. The process of construction of schools in the remaining 3 Vantangiya villages of Maharajganj and two Vantangiya villages of Gonda is in final stage. The

government has made arrangement of land for seven new Kendriya Vidyalayas.

As part of several new education revolution measures, the government has decided there will be 'Pahunch' for school mapping, 'Pankh' for career counseling, 'Pragyan' for library, 'Parakh' for monitoring, 'Praveen' for skill training, 'pahchan' for schools, development of 'Project Alankar Portal' for identification and resource mapping.

Uttar Pradesh is leading in developing an action plan for the implementation of National Education Policy-2020. Availability of subject wise documentary videos on PM E-Vidya channel and Diksha portal and e-text books on council's website.

The government has taken a decision to establish 5 new residential Sanskrit secondary schools. The world today is talking about the importance of Sanskrit and it is befitting that the children are being able to study and relate to it.



To further this idea, there are four diploma courses that have been started by UP Secondary Sanskrit Education Council for employment-oriented education and 18

new Sanskrit colleges have been recognized. There is also training being conducted for 184 diploma level institutes in the state.

Fresh norms for
'Rajya Adhyapak' and
'Mukhyamantri Adhyapak
Puraskar have been laid down.

In Gorakhpur, there has been the establishment and operation of a second Sainik School of the state.

With a conducive environment to study, more and more children are passing out—graduating from state colleges and proving to be invaluable employees.

At present, 52.28 lakh students are studying in 22 state universities, 44 private universities, 171 government colleges, 331 government aided colleges, 1 deemed and 1 open university and 7,372 self-funded colleges.

There is training of new age courses Data Science and Machine Learning, Internet of Things, Cyber Security and Drone Technology is being conducted in government polytechnic institutes.

Work is being done on the establishment of ICT labs and smart classes in primary and higher secondary schools of the state.

The government has proposed a plan to establish smart walls and fully digital libraries in government polytechnics. Establishment of a Centre of Excellence has been proposed to promote Artificial Intelligence has also been initiated.

A much-needed action plan is being prepared for the establishment and renovation of Science City, Vigyan Parks and Planetariums in the state.

CM Yogi Adityanath's dream is to preserve the glory of our education system and with the newest schemes, one can say the process has started.



# Healthcare



P government and the state Health Department, together, have registered a remarkable victory in controlling Acute Encephalitis Syndrome (AES) and Japanese Encephalitis Virus (JEV) in the state.

Together, they successfully controlled 96% of Japanese Encephalitis cases in the state.

CM Yogi Adityanath, launched the Japanese encephalitis (JE) vaccine drive in February 2021 in Lucknow for administration of the vaccine drops to children. Added support from basic and secondary Education Council along with Women and Child Development Department has played key role in building public awareness campaigns for JEV. 

Gorakhpur had been in grip of encephalitis for four decades. Hundreds died every year in eastern UP due to the disease. Since 1978, nearly 25,000 children died of encephalitis. However, independent figures put the toll around 50,000 as many kids die without reaching hospital. Between 2017 and 2018, 920 encephalitis patients were admitted in hospitals.

**MISSION 'DASTAK' AND MISSION 'INDRADHANUSH'** 

In 2017, the state administration handled a vast majority numerous cases of AES and JEV. They soon after, launched 'Dastak' initiative in several districts of UP in 2018 with exhaustive locals awareness campaigns about medicines, intake of clean drinking water, maintenance of hygiene and cleanliness in and around their vicinity which massively helped in fewer causalities born from

the diseases. Both, Japanese Encephalitis and Acute Encephalitis Syndrome are caused by Culex mosquito bites, which cause the disease.

Similarly, the third phase of Mission Indradhanush began in February 2021. The Health and Family Welfare Minister, in February 2021 propelled an intensified Mission Indradhanush 3.0 to expand immunisation coverage across the country, comprising of two rounds—one in February 2021 and the other in March 2021. It was carried out aggressively in pre-identified 250 districts and urban areas across 29 states and UTs in the country. The focus of the intensified Mission Indradhanush 3.0 was focused on children and pregnant women who had missed their vaccine doses during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Ensuring health and wellness for all

ccess to medical institutions is considered one of the basic rights of a citizen. The Chief Minister has always maintained that health infrastructure needs to be constantly evolving especially in the rural areas. The Health Department conducted extensive surveys to identify gaps and policies were framed

accordingly.

Since 2017, MBBS seats have tripled, and more than 25,000 health centres are looking after patients. Such meteoric rise in the health infrastructure was only possible through sheer dedication towards betterment of people. It was the same structured planning which resulted in efficient handling of the Covid crisis even when the

healthcare systems of other countries collapsed.

With world-class health infrastructure being planned, Uttar Pradesh has become a state to replicate when it comes to healthcare policies.

Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana is a flagship scheme of the Central Government under the Ayushman Bharat programme. PM-JAY is the world's largest health insurance/ assurance scheme and provides a cover of Rs 5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalisation across public and private empanelled hospitals in India.

The state government initiated a similar scheme named 'Mukhya Mantri Jan Arogya Abhiyan' include families left out based on socioeconomic status.

- Under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana, 5.21 crore beneficiary cards have been made so far
- A total of 9 crore beneficiaries have been covered across the state
- As per official figures, more than 49.23 lakh families are covered under the Chief Minister Jan Arogya Yojana
- In the last 8 years, an amount of Rs 3,280.95 crore has been

- given for the treatment of 2,37,125 needy people from the Chief Minister's discretionary fund

Over a period of eight years, several upgrades have been made in the field of medical infrastructure since access is not isolated, it is aided and supported by the paraphernalia. In this regard, 250 ambulances of Advanced Life Support Service, 2270 of National Ambulance Service and 2200 ambulances are currently operational under the 108 service.



Ambulance services in Uttar Pradesh catered to over 13 crore 26 lakh patients, including pregnant women and newborns, in the last eight years. Similarly, the 108-ambulance service has helped over 3.57 crore (3,57,24,745) people in emergencies. One of the biggest achievements has been the reduction in average response time from 28.12 minutes in 2014 to just 7.25 minutes in 2025.

The ALS ambulance service has benefited over 7.14 lakh (7,14,552) critical patients, and recently, the chief minister added 125 new ALS ambulances to the fleet. Its response time has also seen major progress, improving from 30 minutes in 2014 to 6.31 minutes by 2025.

The transformation of the medical departments is no short

of a revolution. Every segment of society right from the poor sections to government employees, interests of everyone alike have been taken into consideration while planning medical schemes. The state health ministry has been carefully curating the budget to provide healthcare for all.

Now, more than 5.76 crore electronic health records have been created. Under the 100-microsite project, UP ranks first by registering more than 4.4 lakh records in the state by operating the maximum 35 microsites in the country.

### BATTLING THE MENACE OF AES/JE

Japanese encephalitis (JE) is one of the most important causes of acute encephalitis in Uttar Pradesh. Earlier governments were unable to come up with scientific and medical methods to provide a substantial cure and historically resulted in several deaths.

A milestone achievement and

symbolic of CM's leadership, deaths from AES and JE plummeted from 149 in 2018—comprising 137 AES-related and 12 JE-related fatalities—to zero as of October 2024. Cases also recorded a sharp decline, with AES cases dropping from 1,472 in 2018 to 116 in 2024, and the number of JE cases falling from 174 to just 5 over the same period

The districts of Gorakhpur, Basti, Maharajganj, Kushinagar, Siddharthnagar, and Sant Kabir Nagar in the Purvanchal region were the hardest hit by these two diseases. The virus has been responsible for the deaths of 50,000 children in Purvanchal between 2005 and 2017. Since CM Yogi Adityanath took command, encephalitis became his priority and thanks to his focused and localised approach, the results are visible to all.

An Intensive campaign against AES-JE virus under special communicable disease control/Dastak Abhiyan was carried out. The launch and expansion of the 'Har Ghar Nal Se Jal' scheme under the Jal Jeevan Mission was key in promoting clean water. Nearly 85-92% of households in the affected districts now have tap water connections.

When comparing the impact

of AES in 2024 to 2017, one can see that there has been 76 percent reduction in the number of patients and a 98 percent reduction in the number of deaths.

### NATIONAL TUBERCULOSIS ERADICATION PROGRAMME—A MEDICAL MARVEL

Eradication Programme was successfully implemented. On the 15th of every month,

In February 2025, MDA campaign was successfully completed with 91 percent coverage in 45 blocks of 14 districts of the state.

### **DENGUE CONTROL**

There has been an expansion of testing facilities—36 sentinel laboratories in 29 districts, 86 sentinel laboratories and 3 apex laboratories are functional in all 75 districts of the state.

Mortality rate has also seen a reduction—93 percent reduction in mortality rate (from 0.91 percent in 2017 to 0.06 in 2024 as promised)

#### **MALARIA CONTROL**

There has been a 58 percent reduction in total number of malaria cases since 2017.

Also, the state government successfully undertook the expansion of testing facilities along with an exponential increase in the number of malaria tests by 210 percent.

ABER increased by 218 percent (from 2.01 percent to 6.12 percent as promised). Since 2017, the government has sustained zero mortality rate.

#### MEDICAL EDUCATION

Uttar Pradesh is writing a new

chapter in medical education and public health. There has been expansion of medical seats, opening of new colleges and advancing technology to prepare for a more advanced medical future.

It is not merely about numbers — it's about nurturing a generation of dedicated doctors, nurses, and specialists who will serve every corner of UP. It is about sowing seeds for a future where no patient is left untreated and there is a quality doctor in every region.

CM Yogi Adityanath's healthcare model is saving lives, creating careers, and laying the foundation for a secure future.

With 80 medical colleges, 44 government and 36 private, operating in the state besides the growing network of government and private hospitals in the last eight years has made Uttar Pradesh a

very unique place in the medicare hub.

Before 2017, UP was considered BIMARU. However, Uttar Pradesh corrected the mistakes of the past and rewrote a new future.

In May this year, the CM announced that Uttar Pradesh government will soon launch new health policy to enhance hospital infrastructure across the state with focus on attracting private investment for healthcare reforms. Under the new policy, 200-bed superspecialty hospitals will be established in municipal corporations and 57 district headquarters.

The upcoming policy will be considered a blueprint for the next five years intended to attract private investment in the healthcare sector. Through public-private partnerships, the government aims to expand advanced medical facilities not only in urban centres but also across rural areas.

has brought the world to the
state. Now Uttar Pradesh has
become a hub for medical
tourism while fulfilling the

government that has a dedicated resource management when it comes to electricity supply is one that looks after the future. When you light up a house, you don't just brighten the present, you pave the way for a secure future for the generations to come. In Uttar Pradesh, worrying about electricity is a thing of the past.

For the longest time, UP saw a dark era, in the most literal sense. Poor planning and lack of

infrastructure resulted in major areas of the state left devoid of electricity. In 2017, a new era ushered and the new CM promised that this crucial tenet of development will be redefined.

Over 8 years, the government has gone above and beyond their mandate. In the year 2024-2025, the average supply till December was 20 hours 35 minutes in rural areas, 22 hours 36 minutes in tehsil headquarters and 24 hours

in district headquarters.

Till 2017, electricity supply was available to a total of 1,28,494 villages. Expanding them, 2,94,818 villages were electrified till December 2023. In comparison to about 8.44 lakh electricity connections during the period 2012-17, 165 lakh electricity connections have been issued from 2017 till now.

The CM Yogi Adityanath remarked about the distribution of electricity, saying, "Under the leadership of the Prime Minister, the has achieved the goal of 'Sabko Bijli-Nirbadh Bijli' (uninterrupted electricity to all) in the last seven years. Electricity now reaches every village and majra, ensuring equitable distribution without any VIP culture,"

The increment in the figures suggest that every level of the government functioning that deals with power and supply was rejigged and restructured. Fresh instructions were issued to ensure that there is no oversight. A roadmap was prepared that identified problems in power distribution. The challenges of empowering rural households with increased hours of electricity supply were overcome.

So far, 749 new electricity substations of 33/11 KV have been established and there is a

capacity enhancement of 1528 electricity substations.

One must understand that increasing electricity supply is not merely waving of a magic wand. Further electricity supply development requires expansion and improvement of the entire electricity system, from generation to distribution. This includes building new power plants, upgrading existing infrastructure, and implementing new technologies to ensure a enhance existing supply mechanisms.

In addition to supply improvements, there are efforts to develop Ayodhya as a solar city and Bundelkhand Expressway as a solar expressway. Apart from this, 16 municipal corporations of the state and Noida city are also being developed as solar cities. A solar city is characterized by a solar installing solar streetlights, adoption of solar energy sources in public transport, providing solar-powered amenities such as mobile charging point at public

places along with electrification of government buildings using solar energy and improving penetration of solar power for domestic use.

Uttar Pradesh State Power Generation Corporation has achieved 7140 MW thermal power generation capacity and 1980 MW thermal power generation capacity running in joint venture and 37,056 million units of thermal power generation by December 2024-2025.

Increasing power generation has been a key focus of the government. This adds to state's self sufficiency and meeting long term energy goals.

The government has taken a decision to establish pump storage hydroelectric project to promote non-conventional energy sources. It is proposed to establish a 500 MW solar power project in district Jalaun as a joint venture by Uttar Pradesh State Power Generation

Corporation Limited with Coal India Limited. In another similar

venture, the government will also establish a 200 MW solar power plant in Tehsil Garautha district Jhansi.

The power corporation has decided to set up 2x800 MW Decision to set up Obra 'D' thermal project. The first unit of 3X660 MW Ghatampur thermal project in Kanpur has been completed and production from the second and third units will start from May, 2025 and August, 2025 respectively.

'24x7 Power for All' (PFA) programme has been implemented by Government of Uttar Pradesh with active support of Government of India aimed to connect all unconnected households in a phased to ensure 24x7 quality, reliable and affordable power supply to all domestic, commercial and industrial consumers within a fixed timeframe.

Within this set up, agriculture consumers will also be given supply as per requirement in a cost-effective manner. The Chief


Minister is highly committed to accord the highest priority to the power sector and to provide full support to associated utilities for ensuring quality power supply.


To achieve the goal of 'Power for All', 193 transmission subcentres and related lines have been energised since 2017 at a cost of Rs 24,800 crore.

More than 51941 km of AB cables were installed in place of open wires in 19031 villages/ hamlets with a population of more than 1000.

A 'Revamped Distribution
Sector Scheme' for smart
metering and modernisation of
power system has been
implemented. It was observed
that often electricity reserved for
certain households was not
reaching its destination. A
revamp of the meter system
eliminated foul play and
electricity being only given to
certain VIP areas instead of
common people.

The government has installed 627 capacitor banks at 33/11 KV power substations. More than 1 lakh farmers benefited by removing the ban imposed in dark zones on giving private tube well connections. The Chief Minister has announced that there is 100 percent discount in electricity bills of more than 14 lakh private tube wells. There is

also arrangement to replace transformer within 24 hours if it gets damaged. This has been a boon for farmers and those engaged in rural livelihoods.

The work of installation of 09 thousand 926 new distribution transformers and capacity enhancement of 28 thousand 602 transformers has also been completed. 1 lakh 88 thousand private tube wells were connected in the interest of farmers.

There 3,99,899 private tube wells that have been connected for irrigation facility. Nearly 2695 rural feeders were separated for power supply to farmers. A government that looks at holistic development begins their development from the very grassroots. The farmers are our

providers and ensuring a smooth and hassle-free electricity supply especially for irrigation has given them a new lease of life.

For employment generation and skill development, 3000 Suryamitras will be given training for skill development in the year 2025-26. A total of 1,87,873 private tube well connections were issued from April 2022 to December 31, 2024.

Under the scheme of separation of agricultural feeders, 3,817 agricultural feeders have been constructed against the target of 4,680 feeders.

There is a target of 22000 MW electricity generation under Solar Energy Policy-2022.
Establishment of solar projects of 2653 MW capacity and 508 MW capacity of rooftop solar power

plant with private capital investment. Till the year 2017, there were total installed solar power projects of 288 MW capacity, which has increased 10 times in the last 8 years. The double engine growth model of the government has allowed it to look towards the future while enhancing the present. Solar Power is the future and there have been multiple efforts to enhance it.

Under the Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Yojana, the government has set a target of installing 2.65 lakh units of rooftop solar by 2025-26 and 8 lakh units by 2026-27. The government has been looking to establish solar parks in Jhansi, Lalitpur, Kanpur Nagar, Kanpur Dehat, Chitrakoot and Jalaun. More than 53.354 solar power pack plants under Saubhagya Yojana have been set up. The government has made considerable efforts to promote of establishment of compressed bio gas plant, bio coal, bio diesel / bio ethanol. A compressed biogas plant in Gorakhpur has been built. There is now a 'Jhatpat Portal' for domestic consumers for new connection.

Under the Uttar Pradesh State Bio Energy Policy-2022, 53 projects related to compressed bio-gas, bio-coal, bio-diesel / bio-ethanol have been approved and 24 projects have been established.

Future generations will recall that the 8-year period of the Yogi Adityanath government solved electricity issues for the common public. The electricity infrastructure was enhanced and goals for a sustainable future were set and achieved in record time.

#### **AN ILLUMINATED STATE**

- Rs 2,000 crore proposed for ensuring continuous power supply during the summers, a 33 per cent increase compared to the current year
- A provision of Rs 1,800 crore proposed for supplying electricity at concessional rates to private tube well consumers, which is 20 per cent more than the current year
- Under Uttar Pradesh Solar Energy Policy-2022, the target is to generate 22,000 MW of electricity in the next five years. In 2017, there were 288 MW solar energy projects in the state, which is now around 2.600 MW

The country's book of history contains a very important chapter from Uttar Pradesh. Chief minister Yogi Adityanath's priority after coming to power was to improve the economic situation of the state. An improving fiscal situation has a chain reaction since every other aspect of governance is automatically positively impacted.

With greater disposable income, the purchasing power increases leading to greater production further aiding employment and overall

progress. UP government's efforts to increase the GDP of the state have worked and presently Uttar Pradesh is one of the most economically progressive states.

The state has also come far from weak political will and rampant corruption that bled UP dry. The government's only motive is 'vikaas' and it is being fulfilled by the Chief Minister.

On one hand, vision of the state government is security, development and good governance, fiscal discipline is also inherent in the budget. This



shows that the government has succeeded in accelerating development by following financial discipline.

Uttar Pradesh ranks second in the country with a 9.2% share in India's GDP. In the year 2023-2024, the GDP growth rate of India was 9.6 percent while the growth rate of Uttar Pradesh has been 11.6 percent.

Fiscal deficit is estimated to be Rs 91,399.80 crore in the coming year, which is 2.97 percent of the estimated GSDP for the year. Well Within the prescribed limit of Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM).

Uttar Pradesh being the largest state of the country, despite having the most resources, the GSDP of the state could reach only Rs 12.75 lakh crore from 1950 to 2017.

In eight years, the GSDP of the state has more than doubled and reached Rs 27.51 lakh crore in 2024-25. The figures tell us a compelling



With the vision of rapid development in the state and the ambitious goal of transforming Uttar Pradesh into a One Trillion-Dollar Economy by the year 2027, continuous efforts are being made through well-planned and conducive schemes, developmental initiatives, and where necessary, the formulation of new policies across all sectors of the economy.

In 2023-24, Uttar Pradesh's GSDP (at constant prices) is estimated to grow by 7.5% over the previous year. In comparison, India's GDP is estimated to grow by 9.2% in 2023-24.

Uttar Pradesh's Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at current prices stood at Rs 19.81 lakh crore in the financial year 2021-22. Over the last three years, it has grown at a




compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 13.7%, reaching a Quick Estimate of Rs 25.63 lakh crore for the financial year 2023-24.

The state's overall economy expanded by 13.5% in 2023-24 compared to the previous year. Among the sectors, the primary sector led with a growth rate of 15.1%, followed by the tertiary sector at 13.2%, and the secondary sector at 10.3%. Within the primary sector,

fisheries and aquaculture recorded the highest growth of 34.1%, while mining and quarrying grew by 24.8%. In the secondary sector, the construction sector showed a growth of 17.3%. while in the tertiary sector, other services sector grew by 15.9%.

According to the quick estimates for the financial year 2023-24, the highest contribution to Uttar Pradesh's Gross State Value Added (GSVA) came from the agriculture, forestry, and fishing sector at 25.8%. This was followed by a 14.7% contribution from the real estate, ownership of dwellings, and professional services sector, 13.1% from the construction sector, and 10.2% from the manufacturing sector.

Gautam Buddh Nagar had the highest share in Gross District Domestic Product (GDDP) followed by Lucknow and Ghaziabad. This is a result of direct push by the government to develop regions into industrial and manufacturing hubs. This has led to a booming economy where districts themselves are contributing to all sectors of economy. From hospitality in tourist regions to skilled craftwork, every field is contributing to fulfil the CM's vision and take the state closer to its goals of trillion dollars.



A Zero Poverty program was launched on 2 October 2024 on Gandhi Jayanti which stated that necessary steps are being taken to meet the basic needs of the poorest families by identifying them from every Gram Panchayat of the state. The scheme has been dedicated to Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar for his invaluable contribution to social upliftment.

The government has plans to connect these families with such economic activities, which can generate a sustainable income of at least Rs. 1.25 lakh per year. 



## TRANSGENDER WELFARE AND SOCIAL INCLUSION

Showing empathy and passion



for the isolated and neglected community, Uttar Pradesh is perhaps the first state to have taken steps for the welfare of transgenders. The goal of the government is to build an inclusive society where every individual receives respect and opportunities. UP government has been committed to the welfare of the transgender community.

In 2021, a dedicated welfare policy for transgenders was implemented. The same year, the Uttar Pradesh Transgender Welfare Board was constituted to overlook the schemes.

The first 'Garima Grih' has been set up in Gorakhpur, serving as a safe shelter for transgenders, providing education, healthcare, and skill development facilities. So far, identity cards have been issued to 1,067 transgender individuals, enabling them to avail of benefits under various government schemes with ease, according to the statement.

Additionally, scholarships have been awarded to 248 transgender students, helping them join mainstream education and become self-reliant, it said.

Free gas connection to more than 1.86 crore families under Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana has been provided. Also, distribution of 2 free LPG cylinders was done on Holi and Diwali



A ration card facility has been extended to even homeless and garbage collectors. There is arrangement for doorstep delivery. Upgradation of fair price shops as Common Service Centre has been done.

There has been purchase of 233.99 lakh metric tonnes of wheat from Rabi marketing in 2017-18 to 2024-25 and payment of more than Rs 43,424 crore to farmers was done.



Currently, 497 farmer producer organisations are active, and 6,595 BC (banking correspondents) Sakhis are engaged in advancing financial inclusion. Notably, 106 blocks have achieved their targets under the 'Block Development Strategy'.

The Chief Minister since a long time has stressed the need to strengthen the data collection system for accurate assessment of development progress.

Intensive monitoring of schemes is being carried out by thoroughly

analysing inspection report data.

#### Musahar & Vantangiya



UP creating a new social base for marginalised communities

## AS SOON AS THE GOVERNMENT CAME INTO POWER, THE UP CM TOOK IT AS A MISSION TO ENSURE THE UPLIFTMENT OF THE MUSAHAR AND VANTANGIYA COMMUNITY

he Musahars, known as a rat eating community, reside in the eastern districts of UP and have stayed devoid of social welfare benefits for decades. But Yogi Adityanath changed their lives and fate for the better over the last 8 years. The government has now created a social launch pad for marginalised communities that did not figure in the plans of preceding governments. The neglect was

met with attention and progress became their new identity.

Traditionally, Musahars are beekeepers (honey collectors) and stitch leaf plates for local sales. The community engages in land cultivation, wage labour, fishing, forestry, rickshaw and cart pulling, labour in brick kilns, sericulture and pig rearing. Although the Musahars are spread across different districts in UP, they are mainly concentrated in Gorakhpur,

Varanasi, Maharajganj, Kushinagar, Deoria, Ghazipur, Jaunpur and Chandauli. Kushinagar has the maximum population of Musahars. Nearly, 138 gram sabhas of the district have 10,414 Musahar families in 159 settlements.

At least 10 blocks of the district have dominant Musahar population. Most of the musahars live in 36 gram sabhas of Dudahi block and 30 gram sabhas of Khadda block. Classified as 'untouchables' and branded as a criminal tribe by the British in 1871, the community had been at the receiving end of poverty, oppression and discrimination for several decades. In the preceding governments, although they were included in the Schedule Caste communities in 1950 in UP. government-initiated welfare benefits were never accrued by them. They stayed in lack for the most basic amenities like clean drinking water, food, education, medical facilities and self-employment schemes and benefits.

The Musahar community has been streamlined with education, clean water, housing, sanitation, medical and healthcare services, employment, etc. In a short

span, the community has undergone a major facelift that has helped them find reprieve and rehabilitation from abject destitution.

Vantangiyas used to cultivate crops inside the forest and

were totally dependent on them for their livelihood. These villages were off the revenue map and were living a deprived existence falling on the blind spot of progressive policies. This changed in the last eight years, when UP government decided to help and empower the community through a plethora of initiatives, connecting them with the mainstream world and find improved avenues of education, electricity, media, mobile phones, etc. Much before he became the CM of the state, Yogi Adityanath has been spending Diwali with the Vantangiyas, since 2007.

Even today, while at the helm of state affairs, he makes it a point to celebrate Diwali with the tribal children. Within a short span of 7 years, 5 villages in Gorakhpur and 23 villages in Maharajganj, where the majority of the community is concentrated, were awarded the status of 'revenue villages'.

#### Rural Development



On the path of progress

Mahoba, Baghpat, Jhansi and Lalitpur have been included in the state's top list of districts providing maximum tap connections to rural households. The Uttar Pradesh government has expedited the campaign launched under the Jal Jeevan Mission to provide clean drinking water to the families settled in rural areas of the state.

Other districts of the state are also setting records by working at a fast pace to provide tap connections to the rural households. Mirzapur, Chitrakoot and Banda have been included in this list as well. In 10 districts, clean drinking water from tap has been ensured to 60% rural households. Eight districts have achieved 100% target of tap connections to the rural households.

Embracing technology, overcoming challenges

Starting its digitisation campaign with the state secretariat in 2017, UP government turned into binary mode for its filings and paper work. Under the e-office system, physical files were quickly replaced with digital files, which helped in the expedited disposal of files by preventing wastage of time and paper.

#### JANHIT GUARANTEE ACT 2011

Under the Janhit Guarantee Act, 2011 before the present UP government came into power in March 2017, only 145 services were enlisted of which 55 services were available for the general public, online. The present UP government ensured that all services covered under the act were digitised. Also, E-district, Nivesh Mitra portal and the 'Darpan' dashboard were integrated together on priority. Consequently, at present under the Janhit Guarantee Act 454 facilities of 37 departments are available to the public through online mediums.

#### **DIGITAL GOVERNANCE**

Proactively adopting technology for e-governance has helped the UP administration reach state citizens through its various digitised schemes and polices.
With the novel idea of
'E-Cabinets', the state
government, during the
pandemic, presented its first
paperless budget and the session
was carried out
using tablets. Through 'E-Office'
initiative, several of its
departments have become
functional online.

#### DIGITISATION FOR ATTRACTING INVESTORS

The Nivesh Mitra portal attempts to provide various online incentives and simplifies the traditional processes under an umbrella system of Online Incentives Monitoring System (OIMS), which has also been implemented. The success model of the Nivesh Mitra portal can be gauged by the fact that more than 12 lakh online NOCs have been provided to the concerned applicants.

#### **E-SATHI PORTAL**

Through this portal, set up by the UP government, common citizen can apply for services of e-district through his registered account number, and after disposal of the application, can also download the certificate/ disposal letter from this portal. For this, it mandatory that the citizen registers himself with the portal.

#### **CM DASHBOARD**

The Yogi Adityanath government is setting up a centralised chief minister dashboard to monitor the performance of all the government departments and progress being made while implementing the government schemes and policies across 75 districts. A command and control

implementation of schemes across the 75 districts will be graded along with that of the departments. The performance of the stakeholders along with the accuracy and quality of the data submitted by them will be graded separately. Rankings will be provided on a monthly basis through the two indices.



#### **UP BHULEKH**

UP BhuLekh has been launched by UP Revenue Board to digitise UP land records and make them available to the citizens via a web portal. The government involved the state NIC in this digitisation process, which made land ownership-related details, including 'Khatauni' (Records of Rights), available to all transparently. The portal has been designed to help one avoid the hassle of visiting a tehsildar or patwari he/she needs to verify the UP land record.

THE MANNER IN WHICH THE MAHAKUMBH WAS ORGANISED **GOES ON TO SHOW THAT THE STATE GOVERNMENT HAS** IMPECCABLE VISION TO EXECUTE AN EVENT OF SUCH A SCALE. IT IS A TESTAMENT TO THE CHIEF MINISTER'S RESOLVE OF COMBINING FAITH AND PLANNING



Kumbh Mela: A hub of global faith

he whole world is surprised how such a large number of crores of people gathered on a river bank at the Triveni Sangam. These crores of people had neither received a formal invitation nor any prior information about the time to arrive. People simply set out for the Mahakumbh, and were blessed by taking a dip in the holy Sangam, "Prime Minister Modi said on the completion of the Mahakumbh.

The 2025 Mahakumbh in Prayagraj was more than just a religious gathering. For a moment in time, it seemed like an entire universe came together to witness and become a part of history. Years will pass, the world will spin, galaxies will evolve but no one will forget Mahakumbh since it has managed to etch itself in the fabric of the universe.

The success mantra behind the organisation of Mahakumbh lies in tireless management and an iron will to make things happen. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has been pushing the mantle when it comes to promoting religious and spiritual ideas in the state, especially in the context of tourism. The idea was clear – make Mahakumbh and unforgettable experience.

From the hands that built the tents on Sangam to high ranked officers who patrolled day and night – every functioning member of the administration and society joined hands in making this come about. And the result is in front of us.

Experts claim that
Mahakumbh advanced
Prayagraj's economy by an
impressive 200% to 300%.
During the 45-day Mahakumbh,



over 66 crore devotees visited the city, resulting in immediate profits of 30 to 40 times for businesses dealing in grains, vegetables, mattresses, furniture, tents, and more.

Not just Prayagraj but cities and towns in the radius of 100-200 km benefitted from the footfall. Sectors such as hospitality, transport, and retail saw a boom in consumption.

Mahakumbh 2025, that took place after 144 years, saw the arrival of millions of devotees over these six weeks, having crossed the 66 crore mark. The singular event resulted in 1% growth in UP's GDP, generating more than Rs 4.5 lakh crore in business.

The success was such that people from all walks of life were able to earn livelihoods. The Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in Vidhan Sabha regaled one such example. "I am telling the success story of a boatman's family. They have 130 boats. In 45 days (of Maha Kumbh), they have profited Rs 30 crore... This means each boat has earned Rs 23 lakh. On a daily basis, they earned Rs 50,000 to Rs 52,000 from each boat."

While the figures tell a story, there is a larger message to decode. There has been a conceited effort by the opposition and a certain section of society to discredit the sanctity of Mahakumbh. But every such attempt has fallen flat since the numbers speak for themselves. This once in a lifetime gathering changed the lives of visitors and the hosts alike.

It is safe to say that

Mahakumbh was a world within a world. The city of Prayagraj not only came to life, it created space for life to flourish. It became home for the seers, devotees. The sight of the holy river along with a multitude of people chanting and basking in diving glory, is one for the ages. To make this fever dream a reality, several steps were taken as highlighted through some figures.

- There were 1.6 lakh tents, 100 dormitories with 250 beds. A tent city for dignitaries, VIPs and a judges' colony with 108 units was also built.
- A 400-km-long temporary road network along with 30 pontoon bridges laid on rivers and rivulets was established
- A 1,250-km-long water supply pipeline to distribute water, which was drawn from 85 borewells
- There was a provision of 200

- water vending machines
- 96 power sub-stations,
   366-km-long transmission
   cables and 67,000 streetlights
   were installed for the sole
   purpose of lighting the Kumbh
- 2,750 CCTV cameras for surveillance, 80 variable display message screens, three viewing centres having LED walls and a 50-seater command and control room was built.
- Safety and security were a key aspect and it was ensured through a robust antidrone system
- There were 37,611 police personnel including 18,479 civil police, 1,378 women police, 1,405 traffic police, 1,158 armed police, 146 mounted police and 340 Jal police ensuring safety and law and order
- There were 1.5 lakh toilets, 25,000 dustbins installed in

Mela area, 15,000 sanitation workers, Ganga Sewa Doot and more than 160 number of waste management units making it one the cleanest Mahakumbhs

The statistics tell us that the Kumbh was a meticulously planned. The Kumbh reflects the overall philosophy of the government. In the 'double engine' vision, no person is left behind and vikas encompasses everyone. Similarly, the CM ensured that not even a single detail is left behind and that Kumbh is able to cater to every possible need.

There are several examples of the varied amenities provided during the one month gathering.

There were water ATMs installed by the Jal Nigam in Mahakumbh Nagar. A total of 233 water ATMs were installed by the corporation across all 25 sectors. Through these, pure water was supplied to pilgrims 24 hours a day.

In Mahakumbh Nagar, the 76th district of Uttar Pradesh an OPD was built which saw lakhs of patients. The highest OPD of patients in a day was on the Amrit Snan festival of Makar Sankranti on January 14. The OPD was available 24 hours with facilities of ultrasound and X-ray tests.

More than 2 lakh blood tests were done at the central pathology of the hospital.

Digital Lost and Found centres at the Mahakumbh reunited thousands of devotees. More than 20,000 people who were lost or separated at Mahakumbh so far have been reunited with their families. More than 64% of them were women.

The pictures of the Mahakumbh and the inner devotion drove people in large numbers to visit the gathering. It is further exemplified by the fact that on February 2, a total of 9516 passengers travelled to Prayagraj airport. In this, 4945 passengers arrived by various flights, while 4,571 passengers departed from the airport.

A total of 31 planes landed, while 31 planes flew to other cities. On February 1, 10,599 passengers travelled by air at the former Prayagraj Airport. During this period, 64 scheduled flights operated. Apart from this,

23 non-scheduled flights operated.


These are unprecedented figures for Prayagraj Airport and a telling sign of the excitement of Mahakumbh around the country and the world. It was not just about a dip; it was about being part of something that is unique and sui generis.





ccording to the WTTC report, India's tourism figures for 2024 have already surpassed the prepandemic benchmarks of 2019. The Council's forecasts for 2030 are equally encouraging. Uttar Pradesh holds a unique

and unmatched position in the national tourism landscape—being home to sacred destinations like Ayodhya, the birthplace of Lord Shri Ram; Brijbhoomi, associated with the life and teachings of Radha and Krishna; Tirthraj Prayagraj;

Kashi, the eternal city of Lord Shiva; and key Buddhist sites such as Kushinagar, Sarnath, and Kapilvastu. As national tourism grows, Uttar Pradesh naturally benefits from this momentum, a trend reflected in official data as well.

The Yogi government is fully committed to developing world-class infrastructure focused on tourist safety and convenience, especially at sites with high tourism potential. This development is being carried out in a phased and mission-mode approach. The central government is also playing a pivotal role in this transformation through various flagship schemes.

WTTC estimates that 2025 could be a record-breaking year for India's tourism sector, with the potential to contribute Rs 22 lakh crore to the national economy and generate employment for over 48 million individuals. By 2030, this contribution is expected to rise to Rs 42 lakh crore, with employment exceeding 64 million.

These statistics also highlight the significant potential of Uttar Pradesh's tourism sector, particularly in the realm of religious tourism. The state government fully

recognises this and has prioritised the development of spiritual aad cultural attractions.

As Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath aptly stated, "Efforts to promote religious tourism not only reinforce the spirit of devotion but also catalyse economic growth." He added, "Government initiatives, such as Swadesh Darshan. prasad, and the development of the Ramayana, Krishna, and Buddhist Circuits, have significantly accelerated tourism development in the state. The double-engine government has implemented concrete measures to improve roads, transport. accommodation, and security in key tourism zones."

Due to increasing interest in tourism and the practical implementation of government policies, there has been a remarkable surge in both direct and indirect employment. Local youth are gaining job opportunities in their regions, while traditional handicrafts and regional specialities are receiving renewed recognition and market access. The expansion of tourism is also paving the way for startups and young entrepreneurs to explore new avenues.

Undoubtedly, Uttar Pradesh is emerging as a new hub of tourism, distinguished by its rich historical and cultural heritage, as well as its visionary leadership committed to preserving and promoting it.

#### **TOURISM ASSISTANCE**

- The Tourism Department has announced financial assistance of up to Rs.10 lakh for institutions interested in conducting research on sites
- Attractive provisions have been made under the Tourism Policy 2022. They include various subsidies and incentives for tourism-related enterprises. The grant for research on lesser-known destinations is part of this policy
- The objective of this initiative is to encourage research in the fields of tourism and hospitality within the state. Priority will be given to educational institutions and recognised associations related to tourism, hospitality, and management, ensuring both the quality and practicality of the research
- Ten research projects have been completed in the past two years and preparations are now underway to support new research projects this year as well



UP government is implementing a comprehensive tourism development plan with a strong focus on religious and cultural destinations. As part of this, 272 routes connecting key pilgrimage sites are being developed at a cost of 4,560 crore. Major spiritual destinations are being upgraded to offer world-class amenities to both domestic and international tourists.

Heliport services have already been launched in Lucknow, Prayagraj, and Kapilvastu, with plans to extend this facility to other prominent tourist destinations soon. In Ayodhya, the Ayodhya Research Institute is being modernized, while a new International Ramayana and Vedic Research Institute is under development. Major projects, such as the Buddha Theme Park in Kushinagar, the Veda Science Study Centre in Sitapur's Naimisharanya, and the revitalisation of Naimishar Tirtha and Shukra Tirtha, are also underway.

Heritage conservation efforts include the development of the birthplace of Paramahansa Yogananda in Gorakhpur, and Shringverpur in Prayagraj, the site of Lord Ram's historic meeting with Nishadraj Guhya during his exile. The government is also actively developing all major locations in UP's Vanagaman route, the path Lord Ram travelled with Sita and Lakshman. Notably, native

saplings mentioned in Tulsidas'
Ramcharitmanas and other
scriptures will be planted along this
route, adding authenticity and
ecological value. To further attract
tourists, ropeway projects under the
Public-Private Partnership (PPP)
model have been launched in
Chitrakoot, Barsana, and AshtabhujaKalikhoh, with plans for similar
projects in Prayagraj and Kashi.

The Deepotsav in Ayodhya, launched under the Yogi government, has become a globally recognised event that significantly enhances Ayodhya's cultural identity and branding. The Chief Minister's participation in Krishna Janmashtami in Mathura and Holi in Barsana has further enhanced the global visibility of these festivals, driving increased tourist interest and foot traffic.

Government data show a remarkable surge in tourist numbers, with Ayodhya increasing from 5.76 crore visitors in 2023 to 16.44 crore in 2024, Kashi from 10.18 crore to 11 crore, Mathura from 7.79 crore to 9 crore, and Prayagraj from 5.06 crore to 5.12 crore.






